2018 MEN'S RETREAT UPDATE

As I sit inside where a wood stove is keeping me fairly warm, I can't help thinking back to last summer and the great times that warm weather and soft water gave me. With temperatures forecast for temperatures in the minus column and snow, it comforts me to think about launching my boat into the beautiful Kabetogama Lake and enjoying 80 degree temps while spending time with fellow Christians next July. That trip to "Kab" has been a wonderful time each year to catch up with old friends and make new ones, all the while enjoying some amazing scenery, fantastic fishing, wonderful meals and provocative bible studies.

Now that we all have our 2018 calendars and are making summer plans, take time to flip the pages to July and pencil (only God writes in ink) in the dates for the 2018 men's retreat. July 16th will be the day we depart Salem for four enjoyable days at Kec's Cove resort on beautiful Kabetogama Lake. The friendly crew at Kec's will once again be providing us fine dining, comfortable cabins and a room for our evening discussions. Our retreat planners would like to have the same problem that we had in 2011 when we had more men signed up than Kec's had cabins/bed for. Some last minute situations arose and a few had to cancel which left us with the correct number of guys so I didn't end up sleeping on my boat ⁽³⁾.

Reserve your space on this much anticipated annual event by getting your \$50.00 deposit into the church office now while you are in the summer event planning stage. There will be registration forms in the Narthex kiosk. I will also see if they can be downloaded and printed from the church website for those of you spending these cold days in a warmer climate.

These cold winter days are also a good time to put new line on those fishing reels. Most of the boat captains will probably be running 6 pound test which will provide you with enough strength for Kab's walleyes but present a BIG challenge if you hook into one of Kabetogama's monster sturgeon.

Until July then, stay warm and dream of keeper walleyes stretching your line. If you have questions you can give any of the past participants a call and they would be happy sharing their trip experience.





"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." - Psalm 119:105

Willow Creek Community Church, a mega-church in Chicago, recently did a self study on the effectiveness of its ministry and programs. The report revealed that most of what they had been doing at Willow Creek for many years, and what they had taught literally millions of others to do, was not necessarily producing solid disciples of Jesus. Numbers, yes. Disciples, no.

They found that success was not determined by the size of the crowd, but by the transformation of lives. What they found to be most essential to mature discipleship is... wait for it... regular reading and study of scripture.

Bill Hybels, pastor at Willow Creek said, "We should have gotten people, taught people, how to read their Bible between services, how to do the spiritual practices much more aggressively on their own."

About 100 years ago, a missionary in China urged missionaries planting churches in Korean to focus on adult Bible study programs. One denomination did not adopt the missionary's Bible study plan and today has 1.5 million members. Not bad. The Presbyterian Church did adopt the plan. Today it has 7.5 million members! Choon Hyun Presbyterian Church, a 30,000 member congregation in Seoul, still reminds worshippers in every Sunday bulletin that they are expected to read 3 chapters of the Bible every weekday and 5 chapters on Sundays.

Sometimes we try so hard to develop new things that we miss the tried and true practices that have nourished people of faith for thousands of years.

Salem's 5 year plan calls all of us to engage in at least 2 "faith filled experiments" per year as we seek to learn effective new ways to "Welcome people to Jesus Christ, Equip people with a faith that works in their lives, and Send people out into the world in Jesus name."

A personal experiment I'd suggest for the new year is to try the Choon Hyun 3 chapters per day Bible reading plan. It only takes about 15 minutes a day, and you'll get through the whole Bible in a year! There are many Bible reading tools available. For example, bibleinoneyear.org will send you Bible readings by email or text message every day.

In addition, you might find a partner and talk about the daily readings over coffee or on the phone or online. I find that working with a friend helps to keep me on track – whether it's daily exercise or reading and pondering God's Word.

In 2018, find a way to get into the Bible that works for you, and bring a friend with you! God bless your reading!

Salem's Guiding Principles

Salem's 5 Year Action Plan

In addition to maintaining ministries and programs that are working well, Salem members identified 4 areas of ministry they felt God calling us to concentrate on in the next 5 years. In response to our changing world Salem's council, teams, committees, and individuals are encouraged to engage in faith-filled experiments, to try at least 2 new ministry ideas per year from the list below or from their own ideas.

Evangelism: How do we "Welcome people to Jesus?" Some ideas include:

- Reach out to the neighborhood with faith
 - Pray for the unchurched and events outside our walls during worship
 - During worship, 2 times per year, train all Salem members to welcome and engage newcomers
 - Create at least 2 outdoor public worship services per year.
 - Sponsor events to which the entire community is invited such as open gym nights at the Auditorium, etc.
 - Create "Rock the House" worship experiences
- Reach out to those who've fallen away
 - Make contact with members who've been absent 4 consecutive weeks
- Reach out to the next generation
 - \circ Sponsor at least 4 inter-generational faith events per year
 - Nurture mentor relationships in FINK, Sunday school, etc.
 - Create an "Every Kid Goes To Camp" culture, and full camperships to make it possible
- Reach out to New Members
 - Create and distribute welcome gifts to 1st and 2nd time visitors
 - o Enlist and train "befrienders" who will journey with new members for 1 year
 - Quickly incorporate new members into small groups, studies, and activities that fit their interests and abilities
- Study other churches to learn best practices
 - 3

Youth & Family Ministry - How do we Welcome and Equip Youth in new and

compelling ways. Some ideas include:

- Mountain bike ministry
 - Bike clinic & blessings
 - Intergenerational rides
 - Multiple church events
 - Extra bikes for the bikeless
- Mini Series that appeal to youth
- o Create Youth friendly culture and worship
 - Empower and train youth to lead all parts of worship
 - Incorporate smart phones and social media into communications, study and worship
- Reach out to Young adults
 - Monthly Beer & Hymns or Wine & Word events at a local establishment
 - Coffee shop
 - Create online worship opportunities
 - Create a Salem App for smart phones
- Reach out to Families
 - Create a small group for Moms
 - o Use the popularity of, and information from, VBS to draw families
 - Encourage and promote "Faith 5" family devotion time
 - Create a Pre-school
 - Experiment with new ways to equip busy families with a faith that works in their 24/7 lives

Adult Faith Formation - How do we Equip people with a faith that encourages

personal and corporate growth and knowledge of Jesus? Some ideas include:

- Create a congregation wide small group series for Lent or another season
- Create 2 new confidential focused prayer groups
- Create monthly Adult Sunday School/Forums with guest speakers/presenters
- Enlist 4 Salem members per year to attend Lay School of Theology
- Promote/initiate/develop in-home Bible study/small groups

Stewardship – How do we Equip people with a generous faith and Send people to

serve God with everything they have? Some ideas include:

- Offer an annual "Financial Peace University" style course
- Enlist Salem members to tell "Why I give" faith stories during offering time quarterly or monthly
- Teach about money without asking for any at least 2 times per year using the principles: 1) It all belongs to God, 2) I am a steward, 3) How I live with money is a faith issue
- Create a menu of ways to give that are convenient for 21st century Christians such as credit/debit card kiosks or online apps for electronic giving
- Develop planned gift education programs

WEATHER CANCELLATION POLICY

- The Pastor and Council President will make decisions about any worship cancellations.
- If CI Schools cancel weekday activities due to weather, then Salem activities will also be cancelled.
- People in the congregation are encouraged to <u>call the church</u> to find out if worship has been cancelled.
