From Pastor Mike

"So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation; everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; ..." - II Corinthians 5:17-18

"What benefits does God give in baptism? In baptism God forgives sin, delivers from death and the devil, and gives everlasting salvation to all who believe what God has promised."

- Luther's Small Catechism, Part 4: the Sacrament of Holy Baptism

It is the new year, and the calendar has turned. It feels like we are starting over, and that's not a bad way to look at it. In fact, it is almost Biblical.

Lamentations 3:22-23 says, "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning..." Can you hear it? The grace of God is new every morning, and that means you and I are made new every morning too!

In one of my favorite scenes from the movie "O Brother Where Art Thou?" Two heroes of the story, both escaped convicts, jump into a line of believers and get baptized. As one of the men comes up out of the water he is overjoyed that his criminal past has been washed away in the baptismal waters. Dripping wet, conscience clear, he exclaims, "Come on in, boys. The water's fine!"

At your baptism our Lord made you God's own child, delivered you from death and every enemy, and gave you everlasting salvation. Every week at the Communion table our Lord renews that promise with sweet forgiveness, reminding you that "This is my body given FOR YOU, this is my blood shed FOR YOU." Our Lord has already done it all FOR YOU! Then he sends you out to be his hands and feet and voice in the world.

That means the things of yesterday (or of last year) do not define you and me. Decisions good and bad, choices foolish and wise, victories and disappointments, financial successes and failures, sickness and health, relationships of any kind do not define you. You, child of God, are "new every morning." That's a promise from the One who made you.

So when you get up tomorrow, give yourself a break. Look in the mirror and remind yourself that the day is new, and so are you. In the grace of Jesus Christ, each day, each week, each year, is ripe with new possibilities and new opportunities for you.

We all start the year with 525,600 minutes - as the song goes, every one of them fresh and new, gifts from God. Live them all dripping wet with the sweet promises of your baptism." Come on in! The water's fine!"

As we come to the end of another year, I do so with a heart full of gratitude for the wonderful ministries of Salem, and for the incredible people who serve God by serving others. Every year I am in awe of the amount of ministry that happens at Salem. The number of people who have needs met through the love and compassion of others. The number of people who serve and the hours that are joyfully given to make other people's lives a bit brighter. The amount of hope that is shared through the love of Christ.

This past week alone, 147 inmates at the Crow Wing County Jail heard the "real" Christmas story through Christian volunteers, missionaries, which were also able to share that there is a community of believers that support them and know that through a relationship with Jesus, they can have a new beginning. The same was done with 110 students at MN Adult and Teen Challenge. This was done by hosting parties with pizza, sweets and presents for their children. A team from Salem also rang bells for the Salvation Army at the Westgate Mall, 4 shifts at two locations. 30 people who have difficulty getting out and about were visited and given a beautiful Poinsettia and gift from the Sunday School students. Angel Tree gifts were delivered to children who have a parent in prison. Salem also hosted the MN Adult and Teen Challenge Choir with a fundraiser pancake breakfast, but the true gift was from them as the led worship and shared music and testimonies of what God has done in their lives.

The ongoing ministry through Salem WEST and The Mustard Seed has touched literally 1,000's of people in the past year. Slumberland partnered with Salem WEST in December to deliver new beds to children and adults, they even delivered them for us! Numerous foundations offered financial and technical support. There were many individual gifts and memorials given to Salem Outreach, so more lives could be touched.

The jail ministry distributed many new study Bibles to eager learners and seekers. Beautiful prayer shawls were given to those who were in a time of struggle, so they could feel the love of Christ through the hands of others. Many beds delivered

from Salem WEST had Salem quilts to keep them warm on a chilly night. Hundreds of Honduran children heard the about Jesus and then felt His love as they were fed, clothed and loved by our mission teams. Again, all I can say is Salem is AMAZING!

As we look forward to 2017, we do so with the anticipation that God has big plans for us in the New Year. Thank you for love of Christ that you so freely share. God's peace and blessings for a fantastic 2017.

How do I know if worship is cancelled due to the weather? Good question!

Suggestions:

- 1. Check Salem's website: www.salemdwd.org If Sunday morning worship is canceled, it will be posted on the website. Look there first.
- 2. Listen to the radio. KKIN in Aitkin (94.3) and WJJY in Brainerd (106.7) will report cancellations.
- 3. Call the church and select "Worship Times." Worship cancellations will be recorded there.
