From Pastor Mike

"I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God.

Ephesians 3:18-20

I got to go through Itasca County on the way home from the men's fishing trip. The word "Itasca," for me, always brings back the time, decades ago, when I walked across the headwaters of the Mississippi River at Itasca State Park. As my boys and I stood in that small stream with water running over our bare feet, it was fun to imagine where that water would flow. The stream wound into the woods, barely 6 or 8 feet wide. It sure didn't seem like much, yet it would become the mighty Mississippi.

I think about my baptism in December of 1957 in NE Minneapolis, the moment a little water and the Word of God were poured over and into my life. It didn't seem like much – not even a real bath – yet it was a beginning.

With the promise of loving parents, my life moved into the stream of the congregation's baptismal ministries of Sunday school and confirmation and youth group. From there I flowed into and through the tumultuous waters of adolescence, through the rapids and uncertainties of college life, into the joys and depths of marriage and children, and finally rippling into the deep pools of rich faith community in seminary, and the pastoral vocation. This river (of small beginnings) continues to flow deeper and wider than I ever could have imagined.

Baptism often doesn't seem like much: a little water, a small family gathered, a congregation. But through them begins the life of faith. Through them comes the Word of God bringing grace and mercy and the promise of that which is to come. Like the mighty Mississippi, it doesn't take long for the baptismal river to grow deep and wide.

On Rally Day, Sept. 10th, our worship, faith formation, adult and youth ministries begin again, that all the baptized "may have the power to comprehend…the breadth and length and height and depth" of the river of God's love which flows in and through our lives.

Come, be refreshed and renewed in the waters of a faith community filled with opportunities for fellowship, Bible study, and service. Come, be a part of Salem's baptismal ministries like Sunday School, Learning with Legos, FINK, and SLY where young people are welcomed, equipped, and sent. Feel the river of faith grow deep and wide in, around, and through you.

Monies in the Choice Dollars account have been used for the Music Ministry to help pay for another octave of bells for the Bell Choir. A pair of Conga Drums w/stand, a Djemba, Suspended Cymbals, a Cowbell and a Triangle for the Choir and Praise Team. Funds also have been given to the Memorial Garden account to be used as needed.

START SAVING YOUR COINS!



In mid-September Salem will once again have a coin collection for charity. Two years ago, our coin collection was to benefit solar panel installation in Phebe

Hospital in rural Liberia where there is no electrical power grid. Salem collected \$1700 which is fantastic! The solar grid is now up and running and currently the operating room and the wards have

power and don't have to rely on expensive diesel fuel.

This year's project recommended by the ELCA will be collecting coins and dollars for the starving residents of South Sudan, Africa. South Sudan has been an independent country since 2011 and a severe drought has caused extensive famine. The project's target population is 180,000 severely affected people. The project is halfway through its one year duration and the target dollar amount needed for the whole project is \$9,161,771.

Salem is but a small part of the whole project but WE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE! Stay tuned for further information as September gets closer.

A STORY WORTH SHARING...

A very cool thing happened at Salem in August. This congregation is so great at "big picture" ministry like Sunday morning Worship, Summerfest, Outreach, Lunch Bunch, retreats, etc. But here is a story about something that may otherwise go untold and unnoticed...

Often during the summer months, the children in the neighborhood enjoy riding around the parking lot here – ah, that feeling of riding a bike all day long without becoming winded or nursing the inevitable achy joints afterward! One afternoon a few weeks ago, a couple of local boys rode around in the morning and then had a snack on the lawn near the dumpster. When they finished eating, they looked all around, making sure they weren't being observed, and then threw their snack wrappers over the fence into the caged area. When Glen, Salem's Facilities Coordinator, observed this, he let the boys know that the next time they had something for the garbage, they should let him know and he would help them find a place for it. That was the beginning of a friendship.

Over the next several days, when the boys were riding around, they would wave and say hi to Glen. One of the boys told Glen that he was actually riding a friend's bike since his own was broken. Glen offered to take a look at the broken bike and he fixed it so it was rideable. However, in doing so he noticed that the bike was in very poor condition and had no working brakes. When he looked at the wear on the boy's shoes, he understood how he had been stopping the bike. This weighed on Glen's mind. He shared his concern with Ernie Erickson. Ernie had a bike at home that he thought might work for the boy and brought it into the church.

When the boys returned to the parking lot a couple of days later, Glen presented the boy with with the "new" bike on the condition that he ask his parents

if it was okay for him to accept it. The boy eagerly ran home to get permission and returned to say that he got the thumbs up. In the end, he decided to keep both the old and the new bike, using the old one for parts. The boy was overjoyed and his whoop of excitement could be heard as he tried out the new bike and the reality sunk in that it was truly his.

It is true that there is a lot of great ministry that happens in and through this place. All of us have stories to tell of how God has touched us through others and others through us. And after all, that's what it's all about.
