A Word from Council President, Roger Prill

I would like to start this article off by saying how excited I was to see so many of our church family participating in voting for the 3 members of the Call Committee. What could be better than how very concerned we all are for the future of Salem Lutheran Church and Christianity in Deerwood Minnesota and beyond? Events like this do make a difference as to the path that we will all be taking. Having said that, I believe every person on the ballot would diligently put their all, their time, and their talents, to the tasks ahead. This article is being written before the Council Meeting on May 21, at which time we will be selecting 3 more Call Committee candidates during a closed session. Our decision will be done with much prayer, and much thought while choosing the final 3 people. May 24th the Call Committee of 6 will be announced and commissioned by Pastor Cheryl.

Waiting for results will be very hard for many of us and I pray for us all to have patience especially when we will not be privy to all the information that the Call Committee will gather and be working with. So I ask you, please do not put anyone on the committee in a position that their confidentiality would be jeopardized. Please respect them for that and for their tasks ahead.

Memorial Weekend we will be celebrating our 125 Anniversary and significantly on that same Sunday we will commission our Call Committee. I believe it is a good time to give "Prayers of Thanks" both for our long heritage and for divine guidance as we move forward. As you continue to celebrate Memorial Weekend, let's be aware of the many people, some still here and some that have gone to be with the Lord, that have affected our faith, some in our immediate family and also in our church family. This church has taken a long journey, from a few people meeting in homes to the vibrant Christian meeting place it is now, and prayerfully we will have a useful and meaningful future ahead of us for many generations to come. This will take all of us working together and although we have many groups doing many different missions, and ministries ... we are still one body ... Salem Lutheran Church 1Corinthians 12:12

Our interim time has now moved into **Stage Four – Call Process (6 months - ?).** It is very common for churches to expect that the time to find and call a new pastor is the shortest time of an interim period. Possibly. But it could also be the longest. Typically the *shortest* time it takes from the formation of the call committee to extending a call is about six months. There are several reasons for that, and it has to do with the important preliminary work of your call committee. Following is a typical timetable of the procedure.

1. Orientation Period

The congregation will elect three members of the call committee on May 17. The church council will appoint the remaining three members of the call committee at their meeting on May 21. The complete call committee will be commissioned in worship on May 24.

Once the committee is formed, they will meet with someone from the synod staff for orientation and training. That could take a couple weeks depending on scheduling. Once the committee is trained, they must then complete Salem's Profile, which is a document about 20 pages in length. The call committee uses the Transition Task Force report as a guide in preparing Salem's Profile papers. It is important not to rush this process because this Profile is the first document that potential pastor candidates see, and you want it to both reflect your strengths and be honest about your challenges. The shortest timeframe I have heard that a call committee took to prepare its Profile was about six weeks. So this would put us at mid July.

Once the committee has completed the Profile they submit it to the Synod, who can then provide it to candidates who are interested in interviewing at Salem.

2. Interview Process

The Synod can give Salem only the profile papers of pastors who have expressed an interest in interviewing at Salem once those candidates have looked at your Profile. So, when the call committee completes your Profile, there may or may not be interested candidates. If there are, the call committee will receive the papers of those candidates. If not, all they can do is wait until interested candidates present their papers to the Synod Office.

When the Call Committee receives from Synod the papers of interested candidates, the Call Committee then meets to review those papers, discuss the candidates, and decide which, if any, they wish to interview. Scheduling interviews, of course, takes time. In addition, part of the interview process might be visiting the candidate's church to hear that candidate preach, which also takes time. Once the Call Committee has a Candidate of Choice (it is highly desirous that this be a unanimous choice of the committee members), they refer the name of that individual to the church council.

3. Welcoming the New Pastor

The church council then meets with the Candidate of Choice to negotiate a salary and benefits package. Once that process has been completed to the satisfaction of both parties, the candidate is usually invited to a "Meet and Greet" event at Salem so that the congregation can meet the candidate prior to voting on calling that individual. The congregation then votes on the candidate and the negotiated compensation/benefits package. Once the congregation has voted, presumably in favor of the candidate and package, an official "Letter of Call" is extended to the candidate, the candidate accepts the call, and his or her start date is planned.

It is important to remember that the Call process is highly confidential. So the only information that the Call Committee can share with Salem members -- including Council members, and staff -- is where they are in the process (e.g., working on Salem's profile, how many candidate profiles they have received, how many they are considering interviewing, etc.). They cannot reveal the identity, current location, or even the gender or age of the candidates they are considering. I also will be in the dark during your call process, and won't know any more information than you, as I am not part of the call process in any way once they start looking at candidate profiles.

Remember the call process timeframe is unknown. You might call your next pastor in six months, or it may take a couple years. The timing all depends upon which pastors are looking for new calls, and the work of the Holy Spirit. But rest assured – as God has been preparing you during this interim time, God has also been preparing your new pastor. All will be well – in God's time.

NEWS FROM MISSIONARY, Pastor John Lunn

Greetings to my sponsoring churches! When I wrote to you last month, I had missed the bus from Pennsylvania to New York City because I was waiting on the wrong side of the building. I did catch the next bus and made it to NYC where I stayed with an old friend from early NYC days. I made an overnight trip to Baltimore to meet with the Delaware-Maryland Synod.

From New York, I flew to Nebraska to visit with the Nebraska Synod, and then I flew back to Minnesota. The nursing school I attended – Lutheran Deaconess – was having the annual alumni luncheon so I was very pleased that I was in the states and able to be at one of these gatherings. Even though Lutheran Deaconess Hospital no longer exists, the nurses who went to school there still are making a difference in health care.

I got the chance to preach at my home church and my sister's church – Zion Lutheran – the last Sunday in April, and then got to be part of the celebration of my niece's 30th birthday. She has a two year old boy and her brother and his wife have ten month old twin boys, so it was a lively party! My youngest sister (grandmother to the little boys) made what just might have been the world's largest pasty for dinner.


A few days later, I was on a plane, beginning my long flight back to Arusha, Tanzania. The flights were not bad but they were very long! I had a couple of days to rest, restock, preach, and repack for my next road trip. Our first stop was at Dodoma where I met with the Bishop and Diocese staff. Then we visited the dental clinic at Dodoma Christian Medical Center and met the missionary dentist from Madagascar who works there. He's an excellent dentist and the clinic is very well equipped.

After that, a three hour drive to Singida to stay over night before driving to Iambi. The road was not too bad and the guesthouse seems to be ready for the two volunteers who will arrive in July. Then we were off to Karatu and visited the hospital there. There was a lot of rain and we did get stuck in a rut between the main road and the hospital. Egild got us out, but not until I got a lot of mud on my sandals and my pants! We visited the Doctor-in-Charge and he seems like a very nice guy and a good administrator.

The journey back to Arusha was uneventful. After a day off, I got a Saturday evening call to preach at the Cathedral the next morning and I was happy to say yes. I like short notice – it gives the Holy Spirit a chance to play a bigger part in my sermon.

I flew to Mwanza where I met with the Bishop and also visited Benadetta, the woman who was injured in a bombing in Mwanza.. Then we drove to Bunda to talk with some of the hospital's management team. Then we flew to Bukoba. There I met with the Diocese General Secretary and the doctor who's in charge of the hospital in Ndolage.

Now I'm back in Arusha to start sorting and packing to leave for India in a few days. Please keep me in your prayers as I travel. And also pray for the people of Liberia and Tanzania and India. All of you are in my prayers and I thank God for your support. Peace, John

- 1 2 ½ "eraser
- 1 box of 16 or 24 crayons
- 1 sturdy drawstring back-pack style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)
