Rolf Jacobson is an Old Testament professor at Luther Seminary right now. But he's got his hands in lots of other things too. He hosts an annual "Rethinking Stewardship" workshop each July for pastors and church leaders. He made some interesting observations about our practices one year. He wrote;

God cares at least as much about the money you don't give away to charity as God does about the money that you do. God doesn't just care about the 10% (or 5% or 2%) of the money that you give to God. God does care about the money you share with God, of course. But God also cares at least as much about what you do with the 90% (or 95% or 98%) of the money that you save and spend as God cares about the money you share.

But the church has trained people to think God only cares about the money that we give away – especially the money that we've given to the church.

By emphasizing "the tithe" and giving "off the top" - which are noble ideas – we've accidentally taught people that God only cares about what we give away. You know, 10% belongs to God; the rest belongs to you. Give that 10% to the church, which will use it for God's purposes. The other 90%? Do whatever you want with it.

And we've done the same thing when it comes to the stewardship of our lives and our time. We've told people: "Your time and talents are valuable when you volunteer at church. See, we call you up front and pray for you when you are installed on the church council, or as a Sunday school teacher, or are sent off on a trip with our youth." Some congregations still use "Time and Talent" surveys – which you'll notice are about the options for your time and energy spent involved at church.

We should be telling people something like this: Because we belong to God, everything about us belongs to God: ourselves, our bodies, our families, our time, our relationships – even our possessions. In light of that, the question we ought to be asking ourselves is: how do people who belong to God regard their belongings?

Or even better, we should be asking people, "What is God up to in your spending and saving? Where is the power of the Holy Spirit at work in the dollars that pass virtually through the chip reader when you buy groceries, clothes, gas, and so on? What's God up to far across the ocean when you buy a piece of clothing manufactured in China?"

We could be wondering with people, "What is God up to in my investing" Where is God stirring when I put my money in the stock market?" Or, "What is God up to when I'm tipping my hair stylist, or the single mother waitress who hustles tables all day, or the Uber driver who isn't supposed to accept tips?"

It isn't just the widow's mite that God cares about. Your entire family budget says something about your faith in Christ. Your stock market portfolio may be something through which God is up to good work in the world.

One of my favorite offering hymns (#692) sums up Dr. Jacobson's thoughts on stewardship.

We lift our voices, we lift our hands, We lift our lives up to you: We are an offering.

Lord, use our voices, Lord use our hands, Lord use our lives, they are yours; We are an offering.

All that we have, all that we are, all that we hope to be, We give to you, we give to you.

We lift our voices, we lift our hands, We lift our lives up to you: We are an offering.

Stewardship is everything we do after we say, "We believe." Thank you for your faithfulness and generosity in everything you do!

A Greener Approach to Giving

Churches, because of their heavy weekly check volumes, were among the earliest organizations to embrace electronic giving as a way to automate contributions. Today, electronic giving in all its forms provides convenience for frequent check writers and donation consistency for churches.

A less frequently discussed benefit of electronic giving is its positive impact on the environment. An enormous amount of natural resources are consumed in the production, transportation, processing and disposal of paper checks. That's why paying bills electronically always ranks high on any list of actions an individual can take to improve the environment. The trend toward electronic payments has already produced more than a 50% decline in check use since the year 2000 (report from Vanco Payment Solutions).

Recently we have added a new way of giving – **Online Giving.** You can visit Salem's website, www.salemdwd.org and find the "Make A Donation" button on the home page. You will have the option to set up an account (this is optional), the frequency (set up a reoccurring or one time), the amount of your giving and to which account (general or debt reduction).

Also we are able to use the online as a way to sign up for events. You are currently able to purchase tickets for the Barbary Coast Dixieland Band that will be performing at Salem on July 28. Just go to Salem's home page and scroll down to upcoming events. Look for the Barbary Coast Dixieland Band and click on the "Ticket Button."

As you consider the payment method you use to make your regular offering or for an event, we hope that you will think about the unique connection between financial stewardship and environmental stewardship. About the music

Jazz, which is the first music America can truly call her own, has "Black" roots. The slaves brought into this country from Africa, Spirituals, as we now call them, which are intended to "move the spirit." The music itself was originally based on African rhythms, and eventually evolved into the all encompassing term "Jazz" or "Dixieland," which we hear today. In order to understand it, a study of its component parts follows: Imagine a song where the lead voice carries the melody line. The trumpet or cornet plays the "lead." Lower voices will harmonize or improvise a counter melody which is captured by the trombone. Higher voices compliment the upper register, contrasting the original theme. Traditionally a clarinet makes these notes. Add a rhythm section and you have a band. Early Black musicians took these vocal ideas and played them on the instruments mentioned above. Because these people had no formal music training, they played by ear. Jazz could be called "spontaneous improvisation." You play what you feel, paying attention to what other musicians are doing. Not everybody can be a jazz musician and not every musician can play jazz.

But the fundamental rules for a Jazz Band really apply to living a Christian Life:

The band exists for the good of all its members.

Everyone listens to each other and plays to compliment what the other members are playing. There are no super-stars and a mutual respect for the ability of each player is evident. What is being stated musically comes from the heart. The instruments are an extension of each musician.

If the music sounds good, there is harmony and no discord.



What a whirlwind of a month June has been! Planning, preparing, setting up, and making Vacation Bible School happen is not for the faint of heart! I am incredibly thankful for the volunteers new and old who helped make "Shipwrecked: Rescued by Jesus" happen! So I'll start by saying a huge and heartfelt THANK YOU to EACH ONE of you who gave your time and efforts.

There were 50+ volunteers who chipped in the week of VBS--preparing and serving snacks, leading worship, creating fun games and activities/experiments, teaching Bible discovery, printing/photocopying, tech extraordinaires in the sound booth--some people even showed up every day not knowing what we would be putting them to work doing! There were many more who pitched in during the weeks leading up to VBS, helped with set-up or take-down, purchased snack items, and people who spent time praying for the week and the kids that would be coming. God was doing big things, planting seeds in our little ones as they learned all about how Jesus is our rescuer, and is right here with us through all of life's storms.

We had 58 kids attend VBS this year, along with more than 10 assistant crew leaders--teenagers who gave up precious time during their summers to give back! How cool is that? Throughout the week, we talked about how Jesus is our rescuer when we are lonely, when we worry, when we struggle, when we do wrong, and when we feel powerless.

VBS isn't the only thing happening this month believe it or not-- our youth (and adult leaders) are currently on their way to Galveston/Houston for the 2018 ELCA National Youth Gathering "This Changes Everything." To this

day I look back on the Gathering as one of the turning points in my own faith formation. There is something about being with tens of thousands of your peers, working together to serve the community, worshipping, and fellowshipping, that changes your perspective and changes your heart. It is an opportunity for youth to take ownership of their faith, and witness what a giant, fun, love-filled, incredible family the Kingdom of God truly is. Be praying for safe travels, and tons of fun for our 3 youth and 2 leaders participating!

Starting this week (Thursday, June 28th) Salem will once again be providing a craft/activity at Music in the Park! This week will be a 4th of July themed craft. All kids are welcome to come and join the fun, while our craft supplies last! Contact Whitney, or Raye Cragun with questions, or if you are interested in volunteering during one or more days this summer! Music in the Park is held on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month all summer, at the Crosby Memorial Park from 5-8pm.



We also have youth from Salem who will be serving with the team going to Honduras in July, as well as kids attending camp at VLM (Camp Hiawatha & Camp Vermilion)! What incredible experiences for them to have at such a young age. Pray for them as they encounter new cultures, new friends, and overcome new challenges.

Summer is its own kind of busy in the children's/youth/family ministry world! Well, in general too! While I was abroad this last year, I often dreamed of summer days in Minnesota when I was missing home. I would tell anyone who would listen about the BWCA and our beautiful lakes and forests. There is so much beauty around us, and so much to be thankful for. It sure is great to be alive in God's Great Northwoods! (as we say at camp) I am looking forward to connecting more with our kids and youth this summer and hearing about the adventures God is taking each of them on!
