"Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy ... on it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the alien who is within your gates." – Exodus 20:8, 10b

As I write this it is the day after Summerfest. It is also the day we said "Thank you and Farewell" to Deacon Greg and Diane. These last weeks I've watched as dozens of people worked tirelessly to make Summerfest a great success, and to create a smooth transition at Salem West and Mustard Seed. They did all that in addition to everything else that they do here and at Salem West and at Mustard Seed every day. Thank you for all you do in Jesus' name here and in our community!

It's Labor Day weekend, a time we thank and honor the people who do all the things that get done every day. We honor those who build our roads and those who take away our trash. We honor those who grow our food to those who bag our groceries. Think of all the laborers who faithfully do their work, and how we all benefit from it!

Our Lord commanded us to celebrate Labor Day every week – to take a day off from our labors and enjoy the good earth that God made. It's kind of funny that our Lord has to command us to do that, but apparently he does. We can get so wrapped up in all the day to day tasks of our lives that we never stop, we never notice and enjoy the gift of each day we have on this planet with the people God has given us. So God says, "If I can create and maintain the whole universe in 6 days and still take a day off every week, so can you. Or do you think you're more essential to the running of the universe than I am?"

I have a plaque in my office that a parishioner gave me. It says, "Good morning! This is God. I will be handling all of your problems today. I will not need your help. So, relax and have a great day!" She thought I was getting a little over-involved, that I needed to know I wasn't that important. She was right.

God's command to take a day off began way back when Pharaoh enslaved the people who produced Egypt's goods. When they asked for time off to worship he thought they were just being lazy. He increased their production quotas. You must produce the same quota of bricks, but you have to find your own straw to do it!

It's no coincidence that when those slaves were freed, one of the first laws God gave them was a labor law. "Remember the Sabbath Day... 6 days you shall work, but the 7th day is a Sabbath to the Lord..." It's so important that it's number 3, right after having no other gods and honoring God's name!

The 3rd commandment was not just for personal practice. It was also for employers. It was a reminder that their ancestors were underpaid and overworked. God says, when you have a chance to be in control, you must treat those who work for you differently.

So, take a day off. Give your workers a day off. You deserve it. They do too. Our Lord will keep the world running in your absence. Enjoy God's good earth

End of Call for Greg

With gratitude and grief that reflects the love we have for one another and all the good work we did together, we also say, "Until we meet again." While we remain friends, professional ethics demand that Deacon Greg not perform official actions such as weddings or funerals for Salem folks, nor help manage any of the tasks he always managed so skillfully. Nor should we ask him to.

The NEMN Synod has found that it is best for all involved to keep the relationship between the formerly called person and the congregation simple and unambiguous:

"While Deacon Greg is still a deacon of the Church, his call to serve at Salem, The Mustard Seed, and Salem West has ended.

Members of Salem Lutheran Church and the surrounding area are not to ask Deacon Greg for future assistance in any way, i.e. funerals, fund raising, preaching, pastoral care, etc."

The language may sound a bit "harsh," but a clean break helps the formerly called person move into his/her new position unencumbered with the cares and responsibilities of his/her old position. And it helps the congregation look to their new staff person for leadership. This practice, learned the hard way by many churches and pastors (including me), has always been standard procedure across all 65 synods of the ELCA.

National Youth Gathering 2018 HOUSTON!

After months of preparation, we finally made our way to Houston in the hot sun and high humidity. IT WAS SO WORTH IT! We experienced worship with over 30,000 teens and adults. The excitement and enthusiasm for Christ was contagious. Young people were dancing on the stadium floor, praising and thanking God together. The stage was lit up with a cross and had messages of God's love. We heard speakers tell stories of how with God's grace, their lives were turned around. People who had lives filled with self-doubt, drugs and addiction, self-harm and cutting, anorexia, suicide attempts, who now have lives filled with Christ and want to share their stories. One young girl told us that she wanted the scars in her life to be lighthouses for others on the same path. (Wow!) We learned about God's grace. It's for everyone.

We had a service day at a community center in Houston. We met a woman named Howa, who was from Darfur, Sudan in Africa. She was there to work at the community garden, as she often did. It was HOT. She was dressed in long dark pants, a long sleeved shirt and on top of it she was wrapped in a very long and colorful scarf. She had scars on her face.

There were about 40 of us Lutherans there working beside her. We hand sifted soil from the city compost, creating mulch, top soil and seed starter. We pulled weeds, planted seeds and transplanted vegetables.

Howa came to the U.S. 8 years ago with her children. They were lucky to get out of Darfur. The rest of her family in Africa were killed and she and her family are all that are left. But..... she was so joyful! The smile on her face was so beautiful. She was so excited to have us there working at the garden. She talked about her kids, her home, schools, we showed each other pictures of our kids. Turns out we both have kids graduating from college next year! I was telling her about why we were all there, dressed in the same neon orange shirts. She looked me in the eye, smiling and nodding her head. She said "I know Jesus." She's earning a certificate in farming at the center so she can teach others to garden. She and her friends invited all of us to their homes for dinner that night. Of course, we couldn't do that (we were on a strict schedule), but out of that invitation, they decided to have their own, **first ever** community dinner at the center for everyone, using produce from the garden. Everyone could bring something to share. (Sounds like a Lutheran potluck supper!)

There are so many more stories to tell. Ask us if you want to hear more!

This is what we learned on our trip:

We're all different. We're all quirky, weird, loud, quiet, introverted, extroverted, beautiful misfits. We're all square pegs trying to fit into a round hole.

But GOD says we all belong. "God shatters any idea you or I or we have about whether anyone else is included or belongs." (Pastor Nadia Bolz-Weber)

When you think you are alone, God's love and grace covers us. Jesus showed us we **all** belong. We are all called to start treating each other that way. Step outside your comfort zone and be a friend to someone in need. They are all around us.

We would like to THANK this congregation for the support we received in love, prayers and fundraising. Super one grocery store in Crosby let us bag groceries for tips, we had a jewelry sale (Thank you Lisa Slepica for donating the proceeds), Gary and Becky Guida donated a beautiful, hand-made piece of furniture that was auctioned off, many people donated to our adopt a mile campaign. Thank you so much for sending us.

LIBRARY NEWS

September is a great time to check out books from the library. Less daylight and cooler temperatures make curling up in a comfortable spot with a good book so enjoyable.

According to the most recent Time Use Survey from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the aggregate reading time among Americans has fallen from an average of 23 minutes per person per day in 2004 to 17 minutes per person per day in 2017. The survey data shows declines in leisure reading across all age levels. While reading time decreased, television time increased to an average of 2 hours and 45 minutes.

We can all change this trend. Leisure reading is a great way to improve imagination because one must visualize scenes and characters. Reading comprehension is important to be able to follow directions for appliances, computers, equipment, and safety information. Reading aloud to family members and discussing what was read is a great way to increase communication and express ideas. Books transport us to other time periods, locations, and situations.

The Bible is often called the "Greatest Story Ever Told." Reading the Bible is an excellent way to improve our understanding of God's Word and to deepen our relationship with Him. The Bible is our instruction book for living as Christians. If you are not currently participating in a Bible Study, autumn is a good time to "get back to school" and learn. The Salem Library has many different translations of the Bible. Try them out and see which one "speaks" to you.
