#### "It's Great to be Alive in God's Great Northwoods!"

In August of 2014 Rev. David Lose, the former president of The Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia and the current Sr. pastor at Mount Olivet Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, wrote "Thank God for Church Camps."

"Church camps are, in my opinion, one of the treasures of the church, a treasure that is simultaneously highly valued and grossly undervalued. It's valued by those

thousands of persons who had their faith nurtured at camp, had their leadership skills strengthened at camp, and had their identity stretched and enriched at camp".

"At the same time, I don't think outdoor ministries receive nearly the support they deserve from congregations or adjudicatories (synods, presbyteries, conferences, etc.) that they deserve. I understand, of course, that there are numerous demands on the dwindling resources of church bodies, but I'd argue that we underfund camps at our peril".

"Why? Not only because of the positive impact church camps have on those who attend them, but also because I think that camps offer a model of more effective and faithful congregational ministry in today's world. The counselors and camp pastors, you see, not only have as their goal to help campers – whether kids, young adults, or adults at family camp – grow in their faith, but they've also figured out that in order to help people grow in their faith, they – the counselors and pastors – often have to get out of the way.

That is, one of the huge reasons camp is so formative is that participants are invited to pray out loud and for each other, not just to listen to someone else pray. Campers of all ages are invited to retell the biblical story through songs, stories, skits, and more, not simply listen as someone else teaches about the story. Campers share their gifts in worship leadership rather than just watch as someone else "does it right," which means each and every service both follows a recognizable pattern yet also is distinctly and wonderfully different because of the contributed gifts of those in attendance".

"Camp staff, in short, know that faith is caught, not taught, and that you learn best by doing. Which is why I think they provide an interesting model for those who are interested in nurturing a different kind of faith community in and through our congregations.

Because if we want to create congregations where the people in attendance aren't simply gratefully receiving the performance of the pastor, but instead are learning the key skills of living as a Christian themselves, then we have a lot to learn from our church camps. So on this Tuesday, two days after spending some time this weekend with the great folks at Camp Calumet, an ELCA camp in Freedom, New Hampshire, I want to give thanks to God publically and loudly for the fantastic, formative ministry of church camps and pray that we're both supporting them as we can and paying attention to what they're doing."

We will get a little taste of what happens at camp during VBS June 24-28. That week camp will come to Salem. Three VLM counselors will lead VBS using the Day Camp model. You can still register for a week at camp this summer at vlmcamps.org.

All Salem members are eligible to receive a campership (1/2 the cost of camp) from Salem's Memorial Team. Don't miss it. As they say at VLM, "It's great to be alive in God's great Northwoods!"

June 14th is Flag Day. Reflect on what the flag symbolizes to you and to our country.



Business Item:

Camperships – Salem's policy has been to award scholarships for camp to Salem members. This year we have had requests from members for a grandchild and nieces to receive financial aid for camp. Cathy talked with Pastor Mike and Whitney Cragun before the meeting for input on changing the policy. After discussion, Motion Carried to add:

"If funds are available to offer scholarships to a family member of a Salem member, or to a child who is an active participant at Salem Lutheran Church". We will add this to the 2020 Campership Application.

This will make 5 campers this year. Ryley Bartels, John Frahm, Natalya Childs, Kyla Childs and Chloe Sergot.

#### Salem Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes of May 26, 2019

Council Mission Statement: "We exist with God's help, to provide leadership for the Salem Lutheran Church congregation".

The regular meeting of the Salem Lutheran Church Council was called to order at 5:50 p.m. on May 16, 2019.

Present: Pastor Mike, Meriellen Pisarek, Joel Huntley, Terry Tichenor, Ken Stebbins, Jake Frahm, Di Hein, Jeff Mitchell. Absent: Mark Carlson, John Wojciak.

Opening Prayer was led by Pastor Mike.

Congregational Input: None.

Erik Christensen from Christensen Insurance was present to talk to the Council regarding the current insurance for Outreach and Salem Lutheran Church.

#### Approval of Minutes:

• A motion to approve the minutes from the Council meeting on April 25, 2019, was seconded. Motion carried.

#### Treasurer's Report:

• Council reviewed the Treasurer's Report for April, 2019. Motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was seconded. Motion carried.

#### Pastor's Report:

Karla Peterson, Chuck Lubowitz, Jerry & Shirley Huxford and I attended the NE-MN Synod Assembly, May 3-5 in Duluth. It was an excellent weekend of hearing reports, learning about ministries we do together, study, and debate. Chuck & Karla will present a report soon, but a couple highlights: Dee Dee Frahm presented a workshop on Salem's outreach work as a part of a 3 year ELCA World Hunger grant they received – one of 2 ministries in our synod to receive such a grant. Worship and the music was phenomenal, featuring "Glocal," a group of vocalist/musicians from all over the United States performing music from Christian communities all over the world. A new bishop will be elected at the 2020 assembly, May 1-3 in Duluth. Nominations can be made at our Conference Assembly on February 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

9<sup>th</sup> grade confirmation students completed their Statements of Faith and final interviews on April 24<sup>th</sup>. Confirmation ended on May 1<sup>st</sup> with a pot luck supper and games in the fellowship hall followed by kickball in the Auditorium. Thanks to all the parents, siblings, guides, students and mentors who made it a fun day and a great year.

#### Committee Reports:

- Memorial: Sponsoring 5 campers this year.
- Worship and Music: Discussion was held regarding having a round robin with other Pastors from Aitkin churches on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of June, July and August. Would like the Council's input on this. Worship and Music would like to do a better comparative of having 1 or 2 services.
- Columbarium: Meeting next Tuesday to purchase and plant the Columbarium area. The material for around the bench has been chosen.
- Outreach: The rummage sale brought in \$1,635.00. Outreach is being more selective with what they are taking in. The contractor for the Mustard Seed addition is requiring ½ down before he starts.
- Facilities: Clean-up is done. Repair work is in progress: Gary Guida is putting new block in the entry way; entry ways are being painted; and concrete is being patched.
- Finance: No report. But it was noted that the procedural audit is Monday.

#### Unfinished Business:

- Employment Policy/Pet Policy: Motion to put this topic on next month's agenda after talking with insurance agent was seconded. Motion carried.
- Security team: The team met and looked at Salem West's system. It is a Lorex system. The team feels the Lorex system would suit the churches needs and has talked with Best Buy about installing the system and the costs. Best Buy has recommended a wireless system. Security Team plans to discuss the wireless option with Greg Reed of the Technology Committee.
- Faith Formation Coordinator: Mark has been doing some research in this area. This will be brought up next month when Mark returns.

#### New Business:

- Parking Lot repair funds/new contract: The parking lot repair has begun and is being worked on by Anderson Brothers. Council discussed that the 5 year lease with Deerwood Bank for their 10 parking spots, snow removal and contribution to striping is up in October of 2019.
- Round Robin Summer Creation Series: Discussion was held and Council approves of the round robin summer creation series which will take place on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of June, July and August. Aitkin churches that would participate are First Lutheran Church of Aitkin, Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Bethesda (Rossburg)/St. Johns (Cedar Brook) and Bethesda Lutheran Church of Malmo.
- Discussion was held that the Office Manager Tammy Martin's probation period is over. Council felt she is doing a good job and getting more proficient at her tasks.

Announcements: Outreach received the ELCA World Hunger grant.

Appreciation Dinner is scheduled for May 13, at 5 pm. This is for anyone who volunteers in any aspect at the church.


We won't be going to Honduras this summer.




### **Capital Appeal Update**
