Pastor's Page

Camp Sunday is like the first robin of spring – a little glimmer of hope that summer is indeed coming. Camp Sunday this year is March 22nd. That means it's time to check your calendar and get signed up for Camp Hiawatha or Camp Vermillion.

Dr. David Lose, formerly a professor at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, currently sr. pastor at Mount Olivet in Minneapolis, wrote this reflection about his camp experience.

Thank God for Church Camps! By David Lose

Church camps are, in my opinion, one of the treasures of the church, a treasure that is simultaneously highly valued and grossly undervalued. It's valued by those thousands of persons who had their faith nurtured at camp, had their leadership skills strengthened at camp, and had their identity stretched and enriched at camp.

At the same time, I don't think outdoor ministries receive nearly the support from congregations or adjudicatories (synods, presbyteries, conferences, etc.) that they deserve. I understand, of course, that there are numerous demands on the dwindling resources of church bodies, but I'd argue that we underfund camps at our peril.

Why? Not only because of the positive impact church camps have on those who attend them, but also because I think that camps offer a model of more effective and faithful congregational ministry in today's world. The counselors and camp pastors, you see, not only have as their goal to help campers – whether kids, young adults, or adults at family camp – grow in their faith, but they've also figured out that in order to help people grow in their faith, they – the counselors and pastors – often have to get out of the way. That is one of the huge reasons camp is so formative.

Participants are invited to pray out loud and for each other, not just to listen to someone else pray. Campers of all ages are invited to retell the biblical story through songs, stories, skits, and more, not simply listen as someone else teaches about the story. Campers share their gifts in worship leadership rather than just watch as someone else "does it right," which means each and every service both follows a recognizable pattern yet also is distinctly and wonderfully different because of the contributed gifts of those in attendance.

Camp staff, in short, know that faith is caught, not taught, and that you learn best by doing. Which is why I think they provide an interesting model for those who are interested in nurturing a different kind of faith community in and through our congregations. Because if we want to create congregations where the people in attendance aren't simply gratefully receiving the performance of the pastor but instead are learning the key skills of living as a Christian themselves, then we have a lot to learn from our church camps.

So on this Tuesday, two days after spending some time this weekend with the great folks at Camp Calumet, an ELCA camp in Freedom, New Hampshire, I want to give thanks to God publically and loudly for the fantastic, formative ministry of church camps and pray that we're both supporting them as we can and paying attention to what they're doing.

And thank God for the ministry of Voyageurs Lutheran Ministries, forming faith and pointing to Christ in God's great north woods!

Greetings from Outreach ~ Outreach is Salem, Salem is Outreach!

The last few months have been extremely busy and difficult, so I apologize for not being able to write a connection article. Here is an update: In December we hosted two Christmas parties. The first was at Crow Wing Co. Jail where we served 80 pizzas to the inmates and staff. The second party was for Teen Challenge where we served 65 pizzas to students and staff. In regards to Teen Challenge we are planning to have a summer picnic to include family members.

Honduras Mission Trip ~ This year's trip was extremely successful largely because of all of the donations that you the congregation gave. Because of you, two families already have a home that they did not have before. I wish that you all could have been there to see the smiling faces when they received their keys! We also have told the Missionary that we will fund three additional homes. We were also at Kid's Arch and the House of Blessings where we spent time with about 300 children.

Our team this year was made up of five members of Salem: Chuck, Noreen, Cecil, Debra and myself. We also had five other people join us from St Cloud and Florida. Building homes for people is going to be our goal for the future.

Mustard Seed ~ Our thrift store is off to the best start of the year that we have ever had. I believe that everyone knows that we are going through a transition in management and I want to thank our volunteers and staff for their love of our mission and all the support that they continue to give. We have started our search for a new manager and are beginning to interview potential candidates.

Security Camera

In the words of one of Minnesota's finest artists, Bob Dylan, "the times they are a changing". And indeed they are. Places of worship are no longer the safe havens and places of quiet refuge they once were with open doors for anyone to walk in and spend quiet time in prayer and meditation. In these times churches must be more diligent regarding the accessibility of their facilities.

In that regard, the Church Council has had discussions as to how we provide the best security for the staff and congregation here at SALEM. A year or so ago a small committee was formed to look into how this issue should be addressed. Since then, the committee has gathered information as to what other congregations in the area have done with this issue (many have camera systems), consulted with local law enforcement personnel, and talked to security system installation and monitoring companies to determine what would be a reasonable approach for SALEM.

Two components to upgrading our security system beyond the general building security system that was incorporated into the construction of our new church are being considered. The first would be the installation of a door buzzer/bell and intercom system at the front entry vestibule so that staff in the main office would be able to screen anyone wanting access to the church before allowing entrance which would occur through the church office area. We would like to see this done in relatively short order.

The second component would be a five camera system located at strategic points in and outside the building that would be monitored from the main church office. This system would monitor the parking lot and main points of access to the building on a 24 hour basis. The system would record activity occurring in and outside the building so that if need be, there would be visual evidence of anything criminal that may have taken place.

The committee's research has determined that we use Midwest Security and Fire as the company to work with to implement the security system we are suggesting. Midwest is the company that monitors our general building security system. They are very familiar with SALEM and seem to be a logical choice to provide what is needed. They would provide the hardware, installation, training and tech support required to give SALEM the overall security for our facility, staff and congregation.

At this point in time we have received estimates for both aspects of what is being considered. The buzzer/intercom entrance system would be around \$2,000. The security camera system and associated support will run around \$10,000. Although some may feel these projects seem too expensive, the fact that our facility is relatively large and we have finished ceilings throughout the building requires that whoever does the install must have the skill set to do the job properly and be willing to stand behind what they do. Also the quality of the equipment that we have looked at is excellent and well worth the investment.

These projects are above and beyond the approved 2020 church budget so we will be looking at how we can raise the necessary funds to implement these projects. More information will be forth coming as we move forward on improving our security at SALEM.
