SALEM'S PARKING LOT WORSHIP will be held each Sunday, unless there is bad weather. BRING YOUR LAWN CHAIR TO PARKING LOT WORSHIP! Services start at 9:00 a.m. Households will be able to sit together (socially distanced from other households). There's plenty of room and a speaker system in front of the nearest cars for those who'd like to be outdoors. Those who want to worship in their car will park and tune in to 100.9 FM as normal. Offering will be received and Communion served by gloved and masked volunteers as vehicles exit the parking lot.

Many thanks to the **Nitty Gritty Sabbath Keepers** who lead music and offer the technical support that make our online and parking lot worship possible.

<u>Here are the guidelines for Parking Lot</u> <u>Worship:</u>

- Enter the Salem parking lot on the south side (near the bank). Exit on the north side (near the park).
- A volunteer will hand you a bulletin as you enter the parking lot and someone will direct you where to park.
- The entire worship service will be included in the bulletin.
- Tune your car radio to 100.9 to listen to the service.
- The church doors will remain locked.
- If it is raining at 8 a.m. or after, Parking Lot Worship will be cancelled. We will still be streaming on Facebook and posted on YouTube.

THE MEN'S BIBLE STUDY is meeting online by Zoom at 8:00 a.m. on Fridays. They're studying the weekly lectionary readings. All are welcome. Call/text (715-410-5404) or email (pastor@salemdwd.org) Pastor Mike to receive a Zoom invitation.

Salem's Call Committee for an Associate Pastor is assembled and beginning their work. They will review Salem's Ministry Site Profile and do practice interviews. Currently there are few, if any, candidates available, but when candidates arise they will quickly proceed with interviews. The Call Committee voting members are: Whitney (Cragun) Fisher, Chuck Lubowitz, Ron Ogard, Jeff Mitchell, Don Hales, and Meriellen Pisarek. Pastor Mike will serve on the committee as a non-voting member. Please keep the Call Committee, potential candidates, and Salem's ministries in your prayers.

The Safety team meets every other week to review current synod guidelines and Crow Wing County Covid 19 data. At this time, we are recommending that we consider inside worship when there has been a decline in the weekly percentage rate of new positive cases per 10,000 people in Crow Wing County, over the period of three weeks AND the percent of new positive cases must be under 1% of those tested. Crow Wing county data is available on the MN Department of Health website weekly covid report at the following link:

- Current data through August 1 shows that Crow Wing County's % of positive covid tests completed the week of 7-26 to 8-1 increased to 5-6.99% (last week was 3-4.99%)
- Weekly case rate per 10000 people is also up to 4-7.99. The previous 3 weeks this had been stable at 2-3.99.
- 49 of 87 total counties in MN have a LOWER positive case rate than Crow Wing. (2 week running average used by schools to determine school status)
- The data shows that new Crow Wing County case rates have continued to increase weekly. Therefore, the safety team is recommending that we continue with outdoor and livestreaming worship until it is safer to gather indoors.



New Bishop elected

The Northeast MN Synod Assembly on September 5th. The 320 delegates met online for the first time ever. They heard reports, passed a budget, and elected Rev. Amy Odgren to serve as bishop. **Thank you to Jerry & Shirley Huxford for serving as Salem's delegates.** To see more about the Northeast MN Synod Assembly, you may visit the website: <u>http://www.nemnsynod.org/synopsis-and-results.html</u>

Duluth, Minnesota — The Rev. Amy Odgren has been elected bishop of the Northeastern Minnesota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). She succeeds Bishop Thomas Aitken who was elected bishop in 2008 and is retiring after serving two six-year terms. The election was held in an online virtual synod assembly on August 28 and 29. Bishop-elect Odgren was elected on the fifth ballot with 167 votes. The Rev. Dr. David Carlson, pastor of Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, Duluth,

received 140 votes on that ballot. More than 300 voting members of the synod participated in the online assembly and election. Due to the pandemic, the assembly was postponed from May.

Bishop-elect Odgren currently serves as Assistant to the Bishop and Director of Evangelical Mission for the Northeastern Minnesota Synod. Prior to that she served as Assistant to the Bishop and Director of Evangelical Mission for the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin, and as pastor of ELCA congregations in Wisconsin. Ordained in 2001, she is a graduate of Warburg Theological Seminary, one of seven ELCA seminaries, and she completed a B.A. in education and psychology at Gustavus Adolphus College, St. Peter, Minnesota. She has served on the Board of Directors and Presidential Search Committees at Wartburg Theological Seminary, as well as a volunteer and leader of numerous congregation- and community-based organizations. Concerning her role as bishop, Bishop-elect Odgren said "I see our principal challenge as engaging this culture as evangelists who share the gospel of Jesus in ways that will make a difference in the world. I think a bishop needs to listen extensively, pray often, and be bold to move the vision of the kingdom forward. And through this all, I trust in God's resurrecting grace that keeps working and setting us free to love and serve."

The new bishop takes office on November 1. ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton will preside at an installation to be held on October 17.

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Opening Prayer

Congregation Reports:

- Chuck Lubowitz presented proposed changes on behalf of the Outreach Governing Board. Discussion was held regarding the Outreach Board's proposed changes and desire to make more decisions without Council approval and have more independence.
 - The matter was tabled until next meeting. The Outreach Governing Board is going to send the Council an updated report using the "track changes" feature.
 - The Council also requested specific examples be presented as to when the Council had failed to provide the Outreach Board with the funds or respond quick enough.

Approval of Minutes:

• A motion was made and carried to approve the July, 2020 Council meeting minutes.

Pastor's Report

• Short discussion was held regarding the August report.

Committee Reports

- Treasure Report
 - $\circ~$ A motion was made and carried to approve the Treasurer's report.
 - Discussion was held regarding the 2021 budget process.
- IT Committee
 - $\circ~$ A motion was made and carried to adopt the IT Policy presented.
- Capital Appeal
 - Discussion was held regarding getting pledge cards out and whether to do it separately or not. The matter was tabled for the September meeting.

Unfinished Business

- Discussion was held regarding the Church Office Hours. A motion was made and carried to re-open the office hours to the public on Mondays and Thursdays from 9:00-4:00 starting on Monday, August 31, 2020.
- Motion was made and carried to approve the purchasing of a sanitizing sprayer and sanitizer.
- Short discussion was held regarding Glen Helm staying at 14 hours/week and having Dawn work 35 hours/week.

New Business

- Discussion was held regarding re-opening the Church to allow groups of 10 or less to meet. Several members supported re-opening to small groups as a step forward towards re-opening of the church. Discussion was held regarding the sanitation issues and that the Safety Committee proposals should be followed.
 - A motion was made and carried to allow groups of 10 or less to meet in the Fellowship Hall within the church facility as long as social distancing is maintained and masks are being worn.
- A motion was made and carried to approve the bid and additional labor needed for the LED sign.
- Discussion was held on holding a remote Call Committee meeting. The matter was tabled for the September meeting.
- Discussion was held regarding the status of the litigation and additional funding.
 - A motion was made and carried to move an additional \$5,000 for future legal expenses from line 2910 of the operational reserves to line 2380 in the general fund from the budget.
- An alternate secretary was requested for times when the current secretary either loses service or has to leave meetings. No action was taken.
- Short discussion was held regarding the open choir director position and replacement options. No action was taken.
- Discussion was held regarding Don Hales wanting to obtain a position as a voting member of the Outreach Governing Board. The Council did not approve this request as he is currently an employee.
- Discussion was held regarding the nominating committee and the open positions.
- Discussion was held regarding the re-opening of Salem and allowing in-person worship.
 - Arguments were heard for re-opening for in-person worship which included: people are seeking services from other churches, Salem is the only one not open currently in our area, and we need to re-open before it is too late.

- Arguments were heard against re-opening and included: the health and safety of the congregation, the CDC numbers – specifically for our area, and a desire to adhere to the Safety Team proposals.
- Action was not taken at this time. It was agreed upon that the Safety Team would submit to the Council a proposal as to how we would re-open with a goal of allowing in-person worship by September 21, 2020.
- A special meeting will be held by the Council on September 11, 2020, to review the Safety Team proposals and decide how to proceed.

As the summer of 2020 comes to a close, it is time to start planning your BWCAW trip for next summer.

Voyageurs Lutheran Ministry has been leading BWCAW trips for over 60 years providing positive, meaningful, faith-filled and life changing experiences for youth groups, school groups, families and people of all ages. We would love to talk to you about joining us next summer and customizing a trip for your group's needs. Attached is our soon-to-be released 2021 brochure with current pricing (unchanged from 2019). For those of you who have used us in the past, there are a couple new

things to take note of:

1) In this era of Covid-19 we will be refunding any deposits (or holding them for the following summer) for any cancellations before May 1st. Our current COVID action plans for the summer of 2021 include spacing out groups on site for meals and housing, limiting our program numbers to 50% of 2019's capacity, and increased training and cleaning protocols for guides.

2) Our early bird discount has been extended to Dec. 31, 2020. If you make a trip deposit of \$500 before 12/31/2020, we will discount that total trip cost by \$500.

With our current Covid-19 plans of reduced capacity, our weekly trip capacity will be 3-4 groups/week. This will allow us to spread groups around Camp Vermilion for housing and meal service. BOTTOM LINE- Capacity is limited so if you are looking for a particular week, your deposit and reservation needs to be in early.

What is the Capital Appeal One-year Extension?

The Capital Appeal provides funds to pay the mortgage on the church building. Our current 3-year Capital Appeal, **Stepping Forward in Faith,** will end on November 30, 2020. We have reached and surpassed our goal of \$435,361 for this three-year campaign.

With uncertainty caused by the pandemic, Salem's Church Council (upon the recommendation of Salem's capital appeal team) approved a one-year extension of this current campaign.

Our goal for this one-year extension is \$184,896 to be able to continue our monthly payments at the current rate. In 2009, the building project's total cost was \$2.4 million. Due to the generosity of Salem's members, our mortgage balance has been reduced to \$1.25 million! If we continue to make monthly payments of \$15,408 at the current 3.875% interest rate, we will pay off our mortgage in 2028! This is so exciting! Just imagine the amazing outreach and mission projects that our congregation will be able to do when we no longer have a monthly mortgage payment.

I was baptized in the first Salem Lutheran Church building. There is a painting of that church in the narthex above the organ. My grandparents worked on the rock wall in the second Salem sanctuary. They were so proud of that new building. I grew up in the second Salem building and watched as additions were needed for the growing programs and mission. I remember when Sunday School was in the fellowship hall with black board dividers. Then the education wing and family room were added. The third addition housed the offices, library, and youth rooms downstairs. Now I have the privilege of worshiping in this building with new technology and sound systems. It is amazing for those of us who have been attending Salem for a long time to see how far we have come. We take our mission to **Welcome** people to Jesus Christ, **Equip** people with a faith that works in their lives, and **Send** people into the world in Jesus' name seriously.

This year we are having the stewardship pledges at the same time as the capital campaign extension. This allows us to prayerfully consider how we can best support our operating budget and pay down the mortgage. There will be two different pledge cards to complete.

If your financial situation is uncertain right now, consider making donations when you are able. Memorials for loved ones could be designated to the Building Fund. You might want to make a special contribution to Salem in honor of a birthday, anniversary, or special milestone in the life of a loved one. Tithing your tax refunds, rebates, or other windfalls are a way to put God's good gifts to use.

I have been a member of the Capital Appeal Team since we began planning the current building. I also served on the Salem Memorial Committee and on the Salem Church Council for many years. I am always so awed by the generosity of our members and our community. I know that again this year our congregation will continue to share our **first fruits** and work toward tithing the blessings that God showers on us.
