"And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. - Luke 2:7

Years ago a good friend made us a ceramic nativity set complete with Mary, Joseph, the baby, shepherds, wise men and animals. We have set it up every December, minus the baby. I'd hide him until Christmas Eve when he was placed in the center of the scene.

Every year I'd worry that I'd forget where the baby was. Every year (so far) I've remembered where he was. You don't want to lose baby Jesus!

Apart from my bad memory it is possible to lose baby Jesus in the craziness of Advent. In this, the most commercialized and secularized holiday of all, we are always in danger of losing Jesus. Not the ceramic Jesus of our nativity sets, but losing our way in all the preparations and never finding the holy in the midst of the hectic; never experiencing the expectant purposeful waiting that brings us to the awe and wonder of Emmanuel, God with us, born in Bethlehem.

Every year I warn myself: Don't lose the baby! Because if we lose the baby, Christmas doesn't make any sense at all. Without the baby, Christmas is a beautifully wrapped box with nothing inside. It is empty of meaning, but most of all it is empty of hope.

Theologically we don't need to worry about losing Jesus because Jesus is with us. Our Lord saw to that. In Luke 2: "She gave birth to her firstborn son and laid him in a manger." And in John 1: "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us." In Matthew 28 Jesus promises to be with us "always to the end of the age." No, Jesus hasn't been lost.

Perhaps a more accurate warning would be: Don't lose sight of the baby. That baby, that Word made flesh is the light of the world. In these dark days, we need the light of the world to shine in us and through us more than ever.

This Advent and Christmas go and be Jesus for those who have lost sight of him. Go and show your neighbors the love of Jesus. Go to the dark places and bring Jesus. Go sit with those who are sad and be Christmas. Go and speak the truth into the cracks and broken places in our community. Go, just show up and be the hands, feet, the voice, the love of Jesus. Go and let your light so shine before others, the light of Christ, the light no darkness can overcome.

God bless you and your family this holiday season. And may the peace of God made real to us in a baby born in Bethlehem fill your heart this Advent and Christmas season.

At the November 18 Council Meeting discussion was held regarding the Continuing Resolution that was previously passed at the August meeting. It was amended as follows to provide more precise definition and to ensure that there would be no confusion of leadership between outgoing and incoming employees and ministry teams.

Motion: Any former employee with 2 years or more of employment is not eligible to hold an elected position in the same ministry area for 3 years following their employment. **MSC.**

The following is a very special article written by Nory Hunze about his aunt—or is it his mother-in-law? This Nory & Peggy are active members here at Salem, and their story is so unique...

Mary Jane Olson "The Hat Lady"

Mary Jane Olson was my Aunt and my Mother-in-Law. More on that later.


Mary was born into the Hermeling family on January 4, 1928 in Iona, MN, a small farming town in southwest Minnesota. Mary was one of 12 siblings.

In 1949 Mary married Donald Olson. *Important point: Donald Olson was my mother's brother and therefore my uncle.* I was 2 years old when they were married.

Mary and Donald were married for 60 years until he died in 2009.

Mary & Donald were devout Christians, active in many churches, but so often there to provide care and to serve others: friends, strangers, and relatives. As Pastor Mike preaches, we are all saints, our calling is serving others—that is precisely what Mary & Donald did.

Since Mary & Donald were not able to have birth children, they began the process of adoption. This was in 1959.



In August of 1960 tragedy struck the Hermeling family. Peggy's mother and father, along with 9 other people were killed in a 2-car accident near Reading, MN. Peggy's mother was one of Mary's sisters.

Suddenly, Peggy, her younger brother and sister and her 3 older brothers were without a mother and father. Peggy was 10 years old at the time of the accident. Six children between the ages of 5 and 16 needed a home. All options were explored. Two months following the accident Mary & Donald received a call asking if they would be interested in adopting Peggy and her younger brother and sister. Mary & Donald immediately said yes and the adoption was finalized. Peggy's older brothers were all cared for by other family members.

Since at the time Mary & Donald were my aunt and uncle, I now acquired 3 newly adopted cousins. I was 13 years old at the time.

As time went on, like most families, we shared time together at reunions, holidays and vacations. During

these times Peggy and I became closer. Kind of like kissing cousins by adoption. We were united in marriage in 1973. So upon our marriage my Aunt Mary, "The Hat Lady," became my mother in law. What a blessing for me.



So, if you do not know who Peggy and I are, look for the lady in church wearing a hat. That lady will most like be Peggy, and I will most likely be sitting next to her.

Mary Jane Olson will be dearly missed.

WEATHER CANCELLATION POLICY Salem Lutheran Church

- 1. First and foremost: If the weather is bad enough to question whether or not Worship is canceled, please err on the side of safety and stay at home.
- 2. The Pastor and Council President will make decisions about any Worship cancellations, closing the church office and Outreach facilities.
- 3. If C-I Schools cancel weekday activities due to weather, then Salem activities will also be canceled.

- 5. The main radio stations that will report worship cancellations, church closings or Outreach facility closings are KKIN IN Aitkin and WJJY in Brainerd.
