COLUMBARIUM DECORATION GUIDELINES

Live floral arrangements are allowed to be displayed by the columbarium cross by families for inurnment ceremonies or anniversaries of inurnments. However, per church council approved guidelines, such floral arrangements must be removed within three (3) days of the committal service or anniversary date.

The members of the committee responsible for maintaining the plantings in the Memorial Garden and Columbarium area would like to remind members of Salem that no artificial flowers or other ornamentation are to be placed at or near the columbarium cross. The committee members purchase and plant a variety of new flowers each spring for the flower boxes, planters and large pots in the memorial garden and columbarium area. Committee members are responsible for the watering, fertilizing and weeding of the flowers throughout the summer up until the fall cleanup.

Under special circumstances, the committee will consider accepting live plants to be repotted in existing flower boxes, planters and pots as space allows. Parties wishing this to be considered should contact the church office. The committee will then attempt to accommodate such a request if possible. The committee would also be willing to accept monetary donations in the memory of an inurned family member for the future purchase of flowers for the memorial garden/columbarium.

Salem is committed to providing a peaceful, quiet and contemplative space for family members to use when visiting inurned family members.

Motion: Approve minutes of the April 28, 2022 Council meeting. MSC.

Treasurer's Report

- Terry Tichenor presented the treasurer's report.
- Discussion of restricted and unrestricted dollars for Outreach.
- Income a little low, but haven't tapped into reserves yet.

Action: Terry will check the Music Operating funds – seems high.

Action: Don will talk with the County Commissioner about costs for mattress disposal.

Motion: Elect Terry Tichenor to the Treasurer's position. MSC.

Motion: Approve the April 2022 Financial Reports. MSC.

Follow Up to Salem's Council Retreat – will be held until 1 June from 5:00pm to 7:00pm. Action: ALL: Come having reviewed the Strategic Plan and goals.

Pastor Mike's Report

• Extended thanks to all of Council for all they have done and are doing for the Church!

Pastor Amanda's Report

- Spent 15 hours on marketing with the LED Sign, Facebook/Instagram posts and Welcome Team work. Working to get people in the door!
- Salem is hosting "Music in the Park" on June 23rd. Coordinating that effort.
- Coordinating with the Welcome Team on dates for the New Member Orientation.
- She will lead worship on Bay Lake at 10:00am on August 14th. Sheltered Reality will host worship at Salem that day.

Outreach Report

- Working on Continuous Improvement with a consultant from the Duluth area.
- Working on being sustainable. The OGB will meet with the Council on June 1st to give them a presentation.

Committee Reports

- Technology: Jena noted that they have purchased an HDMI to VGA adapter to connect a laptop to the system in the Fellowship Hall.
- Capital Appeal: Paul noted the current mortgage balance is \$972,367.
- Facilities/Kitchen: No update.
- Faith Formation/Youth: Pastor Amanda noted that there was good feedback releasing the kids early. They will try moving announcements later in the service to give the kids more time. VBS is coming together very well.
- Day Care: Don noted that Cassie will have an answer next week. A letter was sent to request a Grant for Daycare start-up. Should find out next week if we are invited to submit.
- Memorial: The cost for Sunday's brunch and Pastor Mike's gift was underwritten by the Memorial Fund.
- Outreach Board: Nothing additional.
- Stewardship: A meeting was held with Pastor Mike and four others. A committee was formed and Cindy Sykes will chair. Meetings will be held the 3rd Thursday of the month. Next meeting will be June 16th at 10:00am.
- Welcome: Don noted they are working with Pastor Amanda on Music in the Park. Also working to set up another Pretty Good Hotdish at the Brewery.
- Worship & Music: Pastor Amanda noted that we will be singing the Lord's Prayer and Benediction at times. A Hymn Sing will be the last Sunday of the Month.
- Summerfest: No update.

Unfinished Business

- Review of the Summerfest funds from 2021 as they pertained to the April SOS.
- Transition from Pastor Mike to Pastor Amanda. We are not going to rush this. Synod requires a Call Process to make any changes in titles and duties.
 - What does Salem want to look like in the future?
 - Who are we and where are we going?
 - Who are we called to serve?
- Informational Item: Sheltered Reality Drum Group will be present and performing at the Sunday August 14th church service. There will be a free-will offering for them that day. They will not be present at Summerfest.
- Council member to work with insurance companies.
 - Jason will form a subcommittee to bring back 3 bids to the Council.

Action: Pastor Amanda - A pulpit announcement will be made asking for additional members for this subcommittee.

- Roof Update: Some issues are difficult to solve.
 - Band aid drop insulation and spray insulation, may last 5 or 10 or 15 years
 - Grant written for spray foam insulation for \$68K, which will be for the back half of building one.
 - The correct way is to rebuild the roof with layers under the tin, but would need to hire a structural engineer as it adds significant weight to the current structure.
 - More to come...

New Business

- Discussed the Salem Lutheran Church & Outreach Governing Board Agreement

 The voting was moved to next meeting due to absences.
- Budget Info Meeting will be June 12th after worship. A presentation will be made on how we plan on moving forward and have a Q&A time with a panel to answer the questions.
- Discussed the letter sent out about Pastor Mikes retirement
 - Some people didn't like it
 - It was a Synod requirement
- Worship times (and SS times) for the following academic year postponed until next meeting.
- Handicap accessible opener of the two doors to enter the Fellowship Hall some people find it difficult to come in these doors. This will be turned over to the Facilities Team to look at feasibility and cost.
 - Action: Paul will call Al to let him know.
- Discussion of who Outreach Director reports to after Pastor Mike departs.

Motion: The Council President and OGB President will supervise the Director of Outreach until December at which time it will be readdressed by the new Council. **MSC.**

SALEM OUTREACH GOVERNING BOARD MAY 17,2022

Present were: Jason Kempthorne, Chuck Lubowitz, Sandy Kretlow, Pastor Mike, Cathy Aykens, Mark Carlson, Pastor Amanda, Jacob Walker, and Paul Tesdahl. Absent was Teppi Bundy and Jadell Horner.

MSC: Motion, Seconded, Carried

Chuck called the meeting or order.

Pastor Mike opened with prayer. Chuck thanked Pastor Mike for being of service and a part of this group.

Secretary report was e-mailed to each one. MSC

Financial Report: Cathy review our financial report MSC

Scrip Orders for April produced \$59.18 for Outreach.

Jason's Report:

Our donation thermometer for fund raising at church moved another \$5000.00. Our goal is \$80,000.00.

We are waiting to hear from the Initiative Foundation about our grant request. Should hear sometime this week. We put in for \$85,000.00 grant for Phase I at SW. It was due by May 20. We plan on heating the back room at SW and reinsulate. We got a United Way grant for \$7500.00 for furniture.

The garage sale at SW made \$2133.71. Our next sale will be June 7,2022.

Mustard Seed: furniture is coming in again. Sales are good.

Water is leaking into the basement on the east side of the MS. Motion was made for \$397.35 from line #2836 for one load of crushed gravel to landscape the parking lot to slope away from the building. If we need another additional load it should come from line # 7220. MSC

Check on the gutters at MS to see if they are working properly.

Salem West. Roofers have been working at Salem West. Sheets of steels have been peeled back and caulked. We still have moisture coming from our laundry area.

We have received a quote from Garrison Disposal for a compacting dumpster for \$550.00 per month rental and \$250.00 haul fee. Motion was made to check out Garrison disposal for a one-year contract. MSC

We should do a temple talk about our financial goal of \$80,000.00 and our sustainable in the future.

A Ford Transit vehicle that was donated last year. Jason will take it to get detailed and stop at the Ford dealer to see what they would offer us for it.

We had a long discussion on sustainability. What should be done with SW and MS in the future.

We are now looking only at Phase 1 and 2 which is heating the back room and reinsulate and reshelving in building 2 at SW.

Lunch Bunch will start the week of June 6. Carla and Chuck will chair the lunches. We will be asking for donations like boxes of Rice Krispy bars, fruit roll-ups, etc.

Paul apologized for not getting the Summerfest Funds to OGB before now. Back in December council had made a motion to keep Summerfest funds for the moving expenses for Pastor Amanda and Jason. OGB was not informed about this. A

motion was made now in April to give our half (\$7144.74) to us. A second motion was made asking OGB if they want to contribute to the moving expenses for Jason and Pastor Amanda.

It was tabled and we will decide at the meeting in June.

Work between meetings:

Motion from Executive Council meeting April 19,2022: Continue with fixing the roof at Salem West starting May 2nd, using Neumanns. The funding will initially come from the Brainerd Lake Community Foundation (line2895) and then Outreach will be reimbursed from the CARES ACT-\$10k from Outreach and \$10k from the Church. MSC

Note: The Exec Team was given this authority at the last Council meeting.

Below are the motions circulated by email per SLC Bylaws April 20,2022 by Director of Outreach.

Motion 1: Continue with fixing the roof at Salem West starting May 2nd, using Neumanns Construction. The funding will initially come from the Brainerd Lakes Community Foundation(line#2895) and then Outreach will be reimbursed from the CARES Act-\$10K from Outreach and \$10K from the Church.

Motion 2: Withdraw \$20,000. From Brainerd Lakes Community Foundation for roof repair to be deposited into line #2835 Classed Outreach for the balance of the invoice.

We voted by e-mail and carried.
