What's the point of church? Why do we come week after week? Is it to connect with friends? To confess and have our slate wiped clean for a new start? Or to get a fresh outlook before another week of the same-old, same-old?

Do you find comfort in the songs or the liturgy's build-up to Communion? Are you encouraged by a sermon or do you feel connected through the prayers? Does gathering in this community help you serve others outside these walls? Why do we come week after week?

And what do you do when you don't feel "fed"? And what does that mean anyway, for you to be "fed" in church?

These are the questions that haunt me sometimes – wondering what our needs are as people part of a congregation, and sometimes worrying if those needs are being met. But then I'm reminded in the most rewarding ways that church isn't what we get out of it, but what God pours into us.

I'm reminded that the church is about one person – and thankfully that one person isn't the pastor – it's Jesus. It's about God's love shown to us in the one who is willing to die for us. The songs, the confession, the prayers, the sermons, the meal all point to Jesus.


When Jesus is the focus of church, it becomes everything I listed above and then some: connection with other Christians, clean slate and fresh eyes, comfort, encouragement, strength for living, and connection to God.

Some Sundays that message is clearer than others. Sometimes the words spoken or the songs sung or the prayers prayed or the bread and wine received strike a chord with us, move within us, and stir us to a deeper faith in the one who loves us and gave his life for us. Other times they don't. (God help us when those times outnumber the times we feel fed.)

But when we as a church and as individuals have repented are re-centered and re-focused on Jesus, we *will* be fed and filled. Jesus said, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." (John 6:35)

If you're feeling unfed, I invite you to reflect on my opening questions and talk to someone – maybe me! – about your answers. Participate in worship with the question "where is Jesus?" in the forefront of

your mind. And remember, in the times you're feeling unfed or disconnected, God's Spirit is right alongside you with sighs too deep for words. As we move into the busy work of starting up our fall ministries, may these next few months be a time of re-focusing for all of us.

Halfway through 2022 and things at outreach are going well. Thank you everyone for giving wonderful feedback on the Outreach Sustainability Plan. The next step is for the Outreach Governing Board and the Church Council to weigh the comments and make a decision. Moving the Mustard Seed will be a very difficult decision and we ask you uphold the leadership in prayer as they move forward.

As for the ministry! Since January, Salem West has served 200 family referrals and made 127 client deliveries. Amazingly, 377 individuals have received help from Salem West since the beginning of the year due to the work of the volunteers who have served 2,341 hours.

If you were to put a cost on the impact of good and services provided by Salem Outreach, you would find a tally over \$160,000. God truly does provide! Thank you everyone who has volunteered, donated, and made this incredible impact in the Brainerd Lakes Area.



Daycare: Paul relayed Don's report: Cassie is opening the daycare in her own home. Salem has learned much in this process and is prepared if the opportunity arises again. The council agrees that the church is not in the position to begin one at this time.

Memorial: Peter noted 3 college scholarships were awarded totaling \$1,500, distributed after the student's first semester; approved request for \$600 piano humidifier

Stewardship: Pastor Amanda shared the request that each committee reviews and updates the Time and Talent with current ministry information – will be used in September

Welcome: Salem's sponsorship of Crosby's "Music in the Park" postponed to June 30, team is working on a fall "Pretty Good Hotdish" event

Unfinished Business

Discussion on Salem Lutheran Church and Outreach Governing Board Relationship Agreement. Jason highlighted the compilation of previous documents and the proposed changes to OGB's responsibilities.

Motion: Approve the Salem Lutheran Church and Outreach Governing Board Agreement. **MSC** Salem's Insurance Review:

Team of 5 has been assembled, met on 6/23, chaired by Jason Kempthorne

Concerns in current lack of coverage presented. Council guidance: include medical coverage, add coverage for hired/non-owned vehicles in case of carpooling for events, obtain quotes for umbrella insurance for each 1 million increment from \$2 million to \$6 million. Daycare coverage is no longer needed.

Transition Timeline: Pastor Amanda will document Synod's guidance and resources and Salem's options to council members and attach as an appendix to these minutes

Reducing cost for Outreach mattress disposal: still following-up with landfill connections Budget presentation Sunday, June 12 had approx. 30 attendees, no continued comments Church Worship time discussed, one service preferred.

Motion: Worship time for Sept 2022 – May 2023: 9:00am worship. MSC.

New Business

Outreach requests council support to present the Sustainability Plan to the congregation. Discussion led to 10-15 sessions in July at various times and accessibility.

Motion: Council supports Outreach's Financial Sustainability Plan and its presentation to Salem Lutheran Church and volunteers for discussion and feedback. **MSC**

Point of Information: Salem Outreach received a grant for \$75,000 for Phase 1 of the renovation and processing upgrades to Salem West. This includes insulation, heat, plumbing, and electrical work within the back of building 1.

Discussion about Salem Outreach's roof condition – repairs were not substantial to remedy the leaking roof, especially in recent severe weather. Funds from the grant cannot go to general roof repair, but insulating with spray foam potentially seals the roof (back half) from leaks. No repair decisions were made.

Stewardship Timeline: Team is requesting the fall pledge timeline and budgeting process for 2023. Late August, early September is the target for a Stewardship Sunday.

Deerwood Sesquicentennial: Requested Salem's participation in the parade. Too little notice for a committee, but will announce and have individuals take the lead.

SOS

An SOS was submitted regarding the heaviness of the bathroom doors in the fellowship hallway. Building maintenance personnel has been notified and will address the issue.

Pastor Amanda opened with prayer.

Secretary's report was sent out to each one. MSC

Financial Report: Cathy went over the financials. MSC

Jason: We have received split grant from Brainerd Lakes Community Foundation: \$7000.00 received: \$5000.00 for client furniture and \$2000.00 for fuel and vehicle maintenance.

Using Facebook and Instagram has increased the impression to drive new customers. Since Jan 1 we have 1535 Facebook viewers and 318 Instagram viewers.

Will be implementing a new pricing system at Mustard Seed using colored sales tags. We will have 3 rotating colors of tags. One for each of 3 months. We will clearance items on the 3rd month.

Salem West had 50 elementary students from Summer Stretch helping on a work day- over 50 elementary students from 5 districts helped with projects including the reinstallation of the mezzanine level from Schmidt's pole barn.

ELCA Hunger grant is on hold. United Way awarded \$5000.00 for furniture and bedding. We have spent it already on designated items.

Brainerd Lakes Community Foundation awarded \$7000.00 for vehicle fuel and maintenance.

Emergency Food & Shelter Program awarded \$3000.00 for Lunch Bunch. We are awarded \$3.00 per meal given out.

Salem West: SW had 35 referrals for May. Total for the year so far 227. Donations are up, we also have a bunch of new furniture coming in. Shawn our new helper is doing great.

Mustard Seed: Sales are up for the month of June. Good furniture helps sales.

New Business: The garbage compactor is on hold due to electrical requirements not currently in place. Jason will price out a replacement vehicle. Possibly an 18 foot or an 20 foot box truck.

Summerfest garage sale will be at Salem West. The parking lot at Mustard Seed should have some type of activity for Summerfest. We will look into a Bounce House and best item sales from MS, or possibly other vendors.

Grant project at Salem West:

We have one bid for spray foam probably should get a couple more. Get someone to project head the renovation. Get volunteer crew together. Get a job description for what is expected for bids. Godfrey has a bid in for plumbing, should get another bid.

Phase 3 has gone to the church council for discussion. Jason is to set up 3 meetings to explain to staff (volunteers) and others. Possibly a morning, afternoon, and evening sessions.

Fundraising & Sustainability has made about \$7000.00 so far.

The roof at West is still leaking. Spray foam installation should help seal the building.

Motion was made to move \$3500.00 from line # 2370 to Salem Lutheran Church for pastoral moving expenses. MSC

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
