# Daycare Update

Over the past year, there has been much conversation and research around hosting a daycare in Salem's education wing. After much number-crunching and discernment with the license holder, it has been determined that hosting a daycare at Salem is not cost-effective for them at this time.

In the team's research phase, it was discovered that property taxes would apply to the portion of the building used by a forprofit business. Even lessening the square footage of the daycare did not remedy this cost. There was discussion about supporting the daycare in its first year with rent costs that did not cover our expenses, or by covering the taxes, but council did not feel Salem was ready to incur that expense at this time.

Salem will be hosting a New Member Orientation with opportunities to get to know one another, the Lutheran perspective on Christianity, and some specifics about Salem. #### Call to Order

#### **Opening Prayer by Pastor Amanda**

#### **Approval of Minutes**

Motion: Approve minutes of the June 23, 2022 Council meeting. MSC.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Terry Tichenor presented the treasurer's report. Discussed Ruth creating new "classes" in the software to track funds easier. **Motion:** Approve the June 2022 Financial Reports. **MSC**.

#### **Pastor Amanda's Report**

VBS was phenomenal! Amazing energy, great volunteers! Big month for evangelism – Music in the Park and Deerwood's Sesquicentennial.

#### **Outreach Report**

\$75K grant was received for the roof. The goal is to be done before the snow flies!!

Looking at a Diesel box truck to purchase. Still working on Continuous Improvement. The Continuous improvement program participants have identified standardized procedure structure as their working goal.

Trying to find money for Phase 2 of renovation.

Raye Cragun and Ron Martin will finish out the terms for the two resignations on the OGB.

#### **Committee Reports**

Columbarium: No update.

- Technology: Jena noted that they have purchased a UPS to replace the one in the Technology Closet. Capital Appeal: Paul noted the current mortgage balance is \$959,940 at the end of June.
- Facilities/Kitchen: Handicap entrance to Fellowship Hall was voted down due to cost. Clay is doing a nice job on upkeep of the property.

Faith Formation/Youth: VBS was AMAZING!

Day Care: Don noted that Cassie will open a Daycare in her home. It is still a viable option if someone is interested in opening a Daycare in the Church.

Memorial: No update.

Outreach Board: Nothing additional.

- Stewardship: Pastor Amanda noted that the committee has read a book regarding the philosophy of stewardship. Also, the Stewardship committee is in charge of Time and Talent. Each committee needs to review their needs by 18 August.
- Welcome: Don noted that the committee reviewed Music in the Park and we should do it again in the future. They are looking forward to the Pretty Good Hotdish at the Brewery.
- Worship & Music: Pastor Amanda noted that we are changing the flow of worship for this coming Sunday. On Aug. 7<sup>th</sup> our Missionary from Liberia will be here and speak at the service. On Aug. 14<sup>th</sup> Sheltered Reality will be doing the service, and Pastor Amanda will be leading the service at Bay Lake Island.

#### **Unfinished Business**

Reducing the cost of mattress disposal: Don talked with the County Commissioner and this is going before the committee this month. We hope to get \$3k for this.

- Update on Salem's Insurance review: The subcommittee members met with Church Mutual and Brother's Christensen to get bids. Also requesting at least one more bid. Need to make sure non-owned vehicles are covered when used for Outreach business, as well as medical/liability costs for volunteers.
- Transitioning timeline for Pastor Amanda's Salem position: Pastor Amanda passed out Pastoral options as well as questions and tools that need to be considered.
- Action: ALL: Review information, discuss with others, and come up with 2-3 questions that you would like to see on the survey. Send these questions to Jena by 23 August!

Follow-up to June SOS regarding the heaviness of rest room doors in the Fellowship hallway.

Action: Pastor Amanda will check with Clay.

Update the Council members on Outreach's Sustainability Plan Presentations.

There will be a joint meeting of the OGB and Council on Sept. 8<sup>th</sup> to receive comments regarding the Sustainability Plan.

There is an issue with the memorial in the corner of the Mustard Seed parking lot.

If we sell the Mustard Seed, where would the money go?

- **Motion:** The Congregation Council acknowledges that the buildings used by Salem West and the Mustard Seed were paid for by the efforts of the Outreach Program and not provided from Salem Lutheran Church operating or building funds.
- In an effort to provide clear guidance to the Outreach Governing Board and the Congregation Council as they jointly explore various options, it is hereby resolved that any and all proceeds and benefits flowing from the possible sale of the Mustard Seed property will go entirely to the Outreach Program. These funds will be restricted to renovate or maintain the dedicated buildings utilized for Salem Outreach. **MSC.**

#### **New Business**

Discussion of Salem's stewardship timeline plan for 2023. Teams need to have their budget requests in by Sept. 28.

Motion: Accept Salem's Stewardship and Budgeting Process 2023. MSC.

Allocation of 2022 Summerfest funds: Silent Auction proceeds will be split 50/50 between OGB and Church Council. This carries over from the 2019 Council action.

Kennedy Niska is requesting to use a room at Salem to give one on one piano, voice and guitar lessons one late afternoon a week from 4-6pm during the school year. We will look at the Salem Policies to see what options exist. Receipt of \$3.5k from Social Ministries for moving expenses.

Motion: Move \$5k from Summerfest fund line 2370 to Operating Reserves line 2910. MSC.

Salem Facilities and Maintenance person would like more hours. Discussion of having him do the cleaning and not have the cleaning service.

**Motion:** Offer the Facilities and Maintenance person up to 29 hours for facility maintenance and cleaning effective 1 September. **MSC.** 

Action: Pastor Amanda will talk with Clay.

Present were Jason Kempthorne, Chuck Lubowitz, Jacob Walker, Pastor Amanda, Paul Tesdahl, Jadel Horner, Sandy Kretlow Cathy Aykens., Ron Martin, Steve Pauly and Ray Cragun.

MSC: Motion, Seconded, Carried

Chuck opened with prayer.

Secretary's report was sent out to all. No changes. MSC

Financial report: Cathy went over the financials. Our fundraising goal was given a boost of \$60,000 from an unidentified person. MSC

Scrip money for July is \$55.94

Jason: Facebook advertising is helping drive more interest.

We have had 98 people attended the Sustainability planning listening sessions so far. Mustard Seed has started a new sales structure by using colored tags eventually will be 25%. 50%,75% of depending on time remaining in inventory.

Continuous improvement program participants have identified standardized procedure structure as their working goal.

Grants: Grants remain the same as last month except for Otto Bremmer Trust for \$65,000 is under review.

Salem West: Jadel has a new young man from CEP (Concentrated Employee Program) for the summer. Summer donations are heavy. There had been 255 referrals through May.

Mustard Seed: Jake said sales are up in July. This week we will have 25% off white tags in store to eliminate old items.

New Business:

Introduction of 3 people for the position on the board. They were Raye Cragun, Ron Martin, and Steve Pauly. Each of them gave a brief summary on how they want to be involved with the Outreach Board. We voted by ballot. Raye Cragun and Ron Martin will finish out the terms for the two resignations.

Talked about the Ford Transit that we have that was donated. Do we trade it in or sell it ourselves. It needs a new battery and possible some other issues. On line #2825 we have \$32,313 towards vehicle purchase. Discussed options. Motion was made to look at a Diesel Box truck for \$35000.00. MSC

Discussed what to do with Mustard Seed Parking lot for Summerfest. The bounce house is too expensive for insurance. Decision was to buy some tables which we need later anyway and rent a couple small tents. Plans are to take old inventory from the Mustard Seed for the sale.

Motion was made to give Expert Installation from Brainerd the contract for foam installation in the back of building one for \$37,259.00 MSC

Motion was made to go with Godfrey Heating and Plumbing to install a furnace and gas line in back part of building one if the second bid is more than \$4000.00. MSC

We reviewed our Program Priorities and our involvement such as Soup Kitchen, Adult & Teen Challenge, Honduras Mission/Haiti/Global, Jail Ministry, Outreach to homebound, college age, care center residents, and Kids Club after school. We will call some of them to see what their needs are.

We were given a Thrift Works Consultation Report to read, we will discuss at our next meeting.
