It's one of the most quoted passages of Scripture – confirmation, graduations, weddings, and situations of all sorts. It brings comfort, knowing you're not alone through whatever may come and that God has a plan. Know what Scripture it is yet?

Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Glorious, isn't it? Heartwarming, isn't it? Really something you can hold on to, isn't it? You'd really like me to stop there, wouldn't you? But there's more.

These comforting words were originally spoken to people who had fallen away from God and were living out their own plans. God had been calling them back repeatedly, and yet they chose their own way. God had a plan, but the people trusted their own plans and were led away by their enemies.

But there's hope on the horizon. Because the moment God's people turn around, God will be there. Jeremiah 29 continues, "Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," declares the Lord..." (v 12-14).

It's easier to have a God who stays on the sidelines like a coach. When something goes wrong, or we're blindsided by an attack, or we're not sure what our next move should be, we can head to our coach and seek some guidance. We pray, we read the Bible and devotional books, we talk to other Christians, and eventually things get better in our lives. God is there – but only when we want or need God to be.

But what does it mean to seek God when we've got the plays down pat? After all, that was the problem with Jeremiah's audience; things went well and God disappeared from the radar. So how do we keep seeking God when things are moving along and we're confident and comfortable?

Well, we do the same things above but with different intent. Rather than "what can I get from God" when things are rough, shift to "how can I bless and encourage others". Our faith does not exist for us alone – God's plans are always bigger than that. So for a week this month, try to seek God. I invite you to read the book of Ephesians for one week in the month of May. Though you can do it in one sitting, I invite

you to slow down and ponder what stands out to you. I'll post thoughts and quotes on social media and in the weekly news. Set a reminder, put your Bible in an in-the-way place. I invite you to shift your thinking and your heart along with it. Seek God and then watch how God's plans give us all hope and a future.

May God's plans guide you, ~Pastor Amanda

Salem's Capital Appeal



It is with joy and gratitude this information comes to you, Salem Lutheran. Thank you for your diligent work to meet the goals set forth in our Capital Campaign. In the last 13 years we have made monthly payments of \$15,408 toward our mortgage, the required payment at the original rate of 6%. Since taking out the loan, we have rewritten the loan 3 times, reducing the interest rate and consequently the required payment each time. However, the church council had elected to continue paying the original payment amount. That decision has saved us approximately \$145,000 in interest charges.

Near the end of 2022, the Capital Appeal Team took stock of our giving trends and current funds available and made the decision to reduce our payment to \$9,000 per month, still paying \$372 over the minimum payment. This decision keeps our spending closer to the giving of the congregation. The Team will continue evaluating income and additional payments will be made when funds are available. Including April's payment, we have \$869,848.36 remaining on our 2.4 million dollar mortgage. What an accomplishment we have achieved together! Thank you for your faithful giving for Salem's future!

Protect yourself from scams!

Another round of text scams is hitting Salem Lutheran. Remember - Pastor Amanda has a local 218 number and will never ask you for money/gift cards over text or email.

<u>ANY TIME</u> you receive a text message or an email claiming to be from someone you know, double check the phone number or email address the message came from. If you don't recognize it, it's best to call that person - do not reply via text or email!

Tips from the Federal Trade Commission

If you get an unwanted <u>text</u> message, there are three ways to report it:

- 1. Copy the message and forward it to 7726 (SPAM). This helps your wireless provider spot and block similar messages in the future.
- 2. Report it on the messaging app you use. Look in the text's menu for the option to report junk or spam.
- 3. Report it to the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov (you will be asked for your name/address, any identifying information of the sender and the message(s) you received.
