My, my, it has been quite an odd winter. I know many of your joints are giving thanks for the milder temps and your backs giving thanks for the lack of snowfall. But this gal misses winter. I miss the crunch of snow underfoot (or under snowmachine track!) I miss watching my dog bound around searching for the ball that sunk into the snow. I miss sledding down the hill with the kids.

There are some things we count as "givens" in life – such as seasons in Minnesota. We expect to find fulfilling work. We expect friends and family to be around when we need them. We expect health. We expect happiness. But when these things we expect don't come through for us, it can be staggering.

There are large groups of people that wrongly think: If I believe more, if I pray more, then God will get me out of this. God will get me out of this addiction, out of the consequences of my actions, God will fix everything if I just believe more.

But our faith is not escapism from this life. It is an embrace of it. Jesus was fully human, embracing all of who and what we are as people walking around on earth. He knew betrayal and personal attacks, he knew hunger and exhaustion, he knew sickness and cramped muscles. Being fully God didn't exclude him from any of it. He took the bad with the good – death and taxes included.

When these difficulties of life get the best of us, our faith teaches us to trust that God is working and with us in the middle of it all. When storms arose, God brought out peace. When people attacked, God provided a safe way through. When there wasn't enough, God made five loaves and two fish stretch – and stretch – and stretch. When we can do nothing to change our ways, or dig out of an addiction, or find hope, God makes a way.

Wherever we expect death, God brings out life. It's the story of the cross. It's the story of every work Jesus did on other's behalf. It's the story of your faith.

From Romans 6: "As surely as we died with Christ, we believe we will also live with him. We know that death no longer has any power over Christ. He died and was raised to life, never again to die. When Christ died, he died for sin once and for all. But now he is alive, and he lives only for God. In the same way, you must think of yourselves as dead to the power of sin. But Christ Jesus has given life to you, and you live for God."

May God surprise you with life where you least expect it. Peace,



Salem West Impact Report for December and the Year End: For December, we had 43 referrals and completed 38 orders. 99 people were helped in December. For the year we had 644 referrals and completed 469 orders. We helped 1156 individuals in 2023. We contributed \$302,585 worth of goods to our clients in the community during 2023.

The Clothing Bailer is doing well. To date we have recycled 30,000 lbs of clothing in Nov and Dec. We get 12 cents per pound.

Teen Challenge Pancake Breakfast date still needs to be scheduled. Pastor Amanda is working on setting a date for their visit.

o Chocolate Extravaganza fundraiser monies will go to Honduras.

o This month the new bailer recycled 30,000 lbs. of clothes.

o A part-time hire for the Mustard Seed will work with the clothing department.

Audit

o Received call back from Clifton, Allen, Larson CPA's. 3 proposal's were offered that ranged from full service smorgasbord of coverage to consulting services only. Prices of the proposals were: Plan A-Comprehensive Audit \$20,000-\$30,000, Plan B- An audit consisting of financials, practices and policies, and specific areas of concern \$12,000-\$18,000, Plan C- Focus on set number of specific areas of concern \$7,500-\$10,000.

o Mark and Aimee will continue to seek additional sources that could better fit our needs. The audit is scheduled to begin in July.

o Our version of Quick Books is too old to support new revisions, so we must consider updating the system.
