The cross. It's the choice instrument for punishment by the Roman government, a cruel device of torture, and what waits for Jesus at the end of his life. It hangs in most Christian churches and adorns a number of necks. We even sing about it:

"Jesus keep me near the cross, there's a precious fountain..."

"Beneath the cross of Jesus, I long to take my stand..."

"In the cross of Christ I glory..."

It seems like an awful and odd thing to embrace as the symbol of our faith. It'd be like wearing a tiny golden electric chair around our necks, or a lethal injection syringe. Everything about it is shameful and absurd and devoid of any hope.

Then again, it's not any of those things. Everything the world intended the cross to be is transformed because Jesus hung upon it. Here's how Paul puts it in 1 Corinthians 1, "But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God."

The thing is, the cross isn't the end of the story. The cross doesn't have the last word. Shame, despair, betrayal, pain, hopelessness – none of those things have the last word. The cross is emptied both of Jesus' body and all the shame that went with it. The risen Christ has the last word.

So we sing about the glory of the cross, how we need to be close to the hope it holds, how we find new life in the shadow (the effects) of God's grace shown there.

Jesus went willingly to that instrument of torture to transform all things that seem devoid of hope. Because if God can overcome death itself, God surely can transform our broken relationships, our battles within our hearts, our own fears and pain, our own deaths.

I leave you with the second verse of "In the Cross of Christ I Glory":

When the woes of life o'er-take me, hopes deceive and fears annoy, never shall the cross forsake me, lo, it glows with peace and joy.

May God give you hope in the cross that Christ endured. May you see God's love poured out for you and the power of God overcoming all that the world holds against us. May you glory in the cross.

At that session, the Church Council would like to share plans for a summer event, get feedback on the Strategic Plan, and present the budget update.



Salem's Mission and Ministry

Thank you to all who brought offerings to our Lenten services. Your generosity helps our local food shelf and through Lutheran World Relief helps people around the globe with food and emergency supplies.

In the February 28, 2024, issue of the Brainerd Dispatch, Pastor Devlyn Brooks wrote "Christian vs. disciple". He states that the word "disciple" appears more than 250 times in the New Testament. the word "Christian" appears only three times. He suggests that being Jesus' disciples demands more of us than calling ourselves Christians.

Some of the long-time Salem members will be familiar with the MARKS OF DISCIPLESHIP. Our congregation focused on one of these each month and we received bookmarks to remind us of our congregational focus. For those of you who were not here during that year or wish for a refresher summary, these are the six marks of discipleship:

- 1. PRACTICING THE GOOD IN DAILY LIFE Daily Prayer
- 2. OUR HABIT OF WEEKLY RENEWAL Weekly Worship
- 3. HEARING GOD'S VOICE Daily Bible Reading
- 4. THE CALL TO CHRIST LIKE LIVING Serving in & Beyond the Congregation
- 5. OUR CALL TO RELATIONSHIP WITH SPIRIT Nurturing Relationship
- 6. GENEROSITY REFLECTIONS OF GOD'S HEART IN OUR LIVES Giving a Tithe and Beyond.

There is a book by Michael Foss that illustrates how each mark of discipleship enhances and supports the growth of a person's faith journey.

Our Spiritual Gifts Team is focused on numbers 4 and 6. We at Salem live out our mission to Welcome people to Jesus Christ, Equip them with a faith that works in their life, and to Send them into the world to serve in Jesus' name. Mark #4 calls us to serve others. We have so many dedicated volunteers who do so many things in our congregation and community. In June, we will have the opportunity to reflect on the ways that we serve in our church and in our community by placing coins in jars each time we do an act of service. Throughout the year, we have the opportunity to practice Mark #6 as we generously support Salem's mission and ministry with financial contributions. In August, we will ask each of you to consider ways that you can share your Time and Talents in our church and community. In the fall, we will each have a chance to plan our financial commitment to supporting Salem's mission and ministry for the coming year.

Motion to close Emergency Food and Shelter Program Grant FY39 and move the remaining grant balance of \$629.48 to 2305 - Lunch Bunch Program. MSC

Mustard Seed: Mustard Seed Sales \$27,587.00 for January.

Salem West Impact Report For January, we had 75 referrals and completed 55 orders. A total of 120 individuals were helped.

In January there was \$37,093 in goods delivered to the community. The in kind impact for January was \$108,679.

Chocolate Extravaganza went well. Made \$1,465.42. Funds designated for Honduras. Noreen is stepping down from the lead organizer for this event. Discussion was made to discontinue the fundraiser or move the Chocolate Extravaganza to a church bake sale. Will be discussed again later.
