

Salem Connection June 2025

As someone who spends her life working with words, it intrigues and frustrates me how quickly language can morph. I have to be careful how I say something simply because of how it will be heard across generations. An article posted on BBC offers three reasons why language is always changing:

- cultures and experiences intermixing (think: tsunami or sudoku)
- new ideas, inventions, and technologies that merge words (think: email and clickbait)
- old words take on new meaning (think: "nice" first meant "foolish"! or go listen to the chorus of Tim McGraw's "Back When")

Our language around faith and theology is also included in these shifts. When I was a kid, I remember when my church made the shift in the Apostle's Creed from "descended into hell" to "descended to the dead". (I remember being bummed I couldn't swear in church anymore.) People around me stumbled over the change for months, but the clarity and alignment with Scripture mattered more than what we had memorized. By the way, there's still a footnote about this change in our hymnal!

A shift Salem has not yet made is from what we know as the "traditional" Lord's Prayer taken from the Anglican Book of Common Prayer in 1662 and an alternate version which has been in steady circulation since 1977. Shifting away from "thy" language, it also clarifies that we do not believe God leads us into temptation, so instead we ask, "save us from the time of trial." Instead of the childish "forever and ever," it more correctly reflects God's glory "now and forever".

This month, Salem, along with dozens of other denominations, will be switching the translation of the Bible we use in worship. For many years, our denomination has encouraged use of the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV), as the most word-for-word and readable translation of the Bible. It has been replaced with the New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition (NRSVue). The updated edition has been in circulation since 2022 and rights to print the older version have been revoked as of June 1.

Why the shift? The Yale Divinity Library for New Testament Studies writes, "The NRSVue reflects discoveries of ancient texts [such as the Dead Sea Scrolls] and new insights made in the 30 years since the NRSV was last revised. This newly-updated translation offers clearer, more direct, and inclusive language, and increased cultural sensitivity absent of the unintended biases of prior versions." The NRSVue includes over 20,000 revisions, 12,000 of them are substantial. Some of the NRSVue changes include:

- distinguishing between a person's identity and a condition they exhibit: "people possessed by demons or having epilepsy or afflicted with paralysis" instead of "demoniacs, epileptics, and paralytics"; "an enslaved woman" instead of "slave woman"
- better understanding of translated concepts: Philippians 1:10 "determine what is best" changes to "determine the things that matter".
- capitalizing Jewish festivals and holy days (Passover and Sabbath) out of respect

As always, you are encouraged to use your favorite translation of the Bible for your devotion, study, and prayer times. The best Bible translation is one you will read and understand! Just remember, reading a variety of versions helps us stretch our hearts and minds, and gain greater insight into how God continues to faithfully speak to God's people. Read, study, and pray whatever version speaks to your heart – and ask me if you need help finding the right fit!!!!

Motion was made by Kay Bendorf and Linda Sudman seconded the motion to remove \$2,000 out of line 7805 (Client Food) to be used for Outreach Community Projects. This money will be used for the food packaging in Nisswa on Wednesday, May 14th,2025.

Mustard Seed: Mustard Seed Sales for March 2025, \$39,751. March was a good month for the Seed.

Salem West Impact Report for the month of March, we had 47 referrals and completed 31 orders. A total of 59 individuals were helped. Total volunteer hours for March 1,315.

There has been \$99,685 in goods delivered to the community this year.

The In Kind impact report for 2025 is \$212,674.14.

New Business:

Jake talked about how well the Mustard Seed was doing. He brought in a Daily Sales report. This was so helpful to see all the categories of sales from this period to compare to last period. Showing the growth in all areas.

Jake talked about promoting more Volunteers Jake-Emily Days July 19th.

Jake will be setting up a booth at Emily Days to promote the Mustard Seed/Salem West. He will educate people about the Mustard Seed/ Salem West. He will hand out business cards, recruit volunteers, talk about our Outreach Program and Donation Center.

*Will need coverage at The Mustard Seed while he is gone that day.

POP (Power Of Produce) This was a flyer given to Pastor Amanda from the Cuyuna Farmers Market. It is a sponsorship for kids ages 2-12. If you Donate \$500 you will get your name on a banner that will be hung at the Cuyuna Farmers Market. We also help kids age 2-12 who come to the Farmers Market. The kids will receive a \$2.00 coupon to use at the Market. This is a great way to give back to our community and get our name out there.

Motion was made by Jason Kempthorne and seconded by Cathy Aykens to remove \$500.00 from 2705 (Food Shelf/ Share) to go towards this program, POP (Power Of Produce).
