In the early days of Christianity, long before there were church buildings or formal structures, believers gathered in homes, courtyards, by waters, and quiet spaces. They came together not out of obligation, but out of love for Christ and for one another. People heard the news that their sins were forgiven and their souls secure, and it changed they way they operated in the world. Acts 2:44-47 paints a beautiful picture:

"All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by

day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

These were not just religious meetings with specific songs and prayers, they were vibrant communities where people knew each other, shared life together, and cared deeply for those around them. The early church wasn't just a place to worship; it was a way of living.

Our culture would not support this type of community – it's sad, but true. The places where people do live like this are ripe for abuse of power and quickly turn into cults where one's individuality is absorbed along with their assets.

Yet, that same spirit of compassion and community is what we are still called to embody today. In a world filled with loneliness, hardship, and division, the Church is needed more than ever, not just as a building, but as a people who live out the love of Christ. When we listen to one another, provide a meal for someone going through a tough time, or simply show up with a kind word, we are being the Church. When we create spaces where everyone feels safe, seen, and supported, we are echoing the heart of those first gatherings.

Don't be fooled though, that life does cost us something. It means we set aside the focus on our own needs in favor of serving the people around us... (and it's harder to do that than to sell your possessions and donate the money!) But we do this out of love for Christ and for one another.

The Spirit is always working to make us into a church that isn't defined by walls or programs or style of worship, but by the generous, intentional, and unconditional way we love. Let's be the Church not only for the ones who come on Sunday morning, but for everyone – the hurting, the hopeful, the curious, the weary, and the seeking. As we do so, the Lord will add to our number day by day.

Dear Church Family,

First and foremost, we want to express our heartfelt gratitude to each of you for embarking on this incredible mission to help our neighbors in need. Your vision for the future has been a guiding light, transforming our humble beginnings in the church basement into the thriving community service we now see in the Mustard Seed and Salem West.

This growth has been nothing short of amazing. However, as we have consolidated our efforts into one location and expanded the groups we serve, we've encountered some confusion about our identity. To some, Salem West is merely a drop-off point for donations. To others, it serves as a vital resource for social workers or a hub for businesses and volunteer groups seeking to assist our community. And then there's the Mustard Seed, which sells goods to generate funds for our mission.

Transitioning to a single name will take time and effort, but we believe this change will allow us to streamline our focus on our true mission: helping our neighbors in need. Together, let's embrace this opportunity for clarity and unity as we continue to make a positive impact in our community.

Dear Salem Family,

Thank you to all who regularly support Salem's mission and ministries financially and with your time. We also want to thank the community for the generous donations to Salem West and the Mustard Seed and the shoppers who support our Outreach Ministry. Volunteers are essential to these endeavors.

Currently our income from offerings and pledges is not enough to cover our church operating expenses. We have had to use our reserves to cover some of the costs of our staff, utilities, benevolences, and programming. A Congregational Meeting is planned for July 27th to address the budget shortfall and to hear your ideas for options. Our giving patterns are down, and our staff has been very frugal with their spending. It is also time for us to plan the 2026 budget, and we are interested in knowing your priorities.

The Council has a goal of Improving Communication. We have used articles in the Connection, Congregational updates, and the Suggestion, Observations, and Solutions box. We are interested in your feedback and ways that you would like to communicate with the Council. Changes have been made because of a survey of the congregation that was done in the Fall of 2023. We want to know what you think.

Capital Appeal 2024-2027 Update



Feeding Our Community

A group of volunteers went to The Outreach Program of Brainerd Lakes in Nisswa, MN on May 14th! Many of our confirmation students and their mentors attended along with a handful of other congregation members and friends to help package ready-to-cook meals for those hungry in our community. Our Lil' Free Pantry is small in size but massive with the impact it holds on our area! The pantry is located by the education wing, to the left of the front doors! This pantry is always open and available to those who need items to fill their own pantry. The group in early May packed over 1,200 packages of food, which can serve over 7,000 people! Our church got to take home 16 boxes filled with these meals, allowing for our pantry to stay nicely stocked for many weeks to come! If you know someone or you yourself are in need of a meal or two, we encourage you to take what you need and leave what you can at the Lil' Free Pantry!

There has been \$138,180 in goods delivered to the community YTD.

The In Kind impact is \$294,295.54 YTD.

A financial question was brought up for attention on why liabilities are added into the total net asset on the Salem Outreach & Mustard Seed Dedicated balance sheet of 4/30/2025. Jason was going to check with Amy on this.

The Mustard Seed ad will be back on the radio starting in June. The audience on Facebook and Instagram continues to grow.

A Salem Outreach Survey was sent to all volunteers and paid staff employees at the Mustard Seed/ Salem West. Jason and Jake highly encouraged everyone to fill out this survey. Great way to get feedback on how the Mustard Seed/ Salem West is doing.

Fall service project –Nationwide ELCA Service day is September 7th. GWOH –Gods Work Our Hands. We discussed what we might want to do as a group on this day. Some ideas were:

- Food packaging here at Salem Church
- Fall clean up at a few people's houses.
- Bring more ideas to the next meeting.

Mission Trip 2026 was discussed. Do we go back to Honduras or do we look for something new in the US? We will discuss more ideas at the June meeting.

Quilters would like \$75.00 to get a quilt quilted. They will be donating this quilt for Deerwood Days. This will be brought to the council for request.
