Are you someone who orders the same entrée at a restaurant? Do you use the same lure every time you fish? Do you have a normal route you drive, or a routine you follow every morning? How often do you try something new? Most people tend to be creatures of habit. In my grandfather's words, "I know what I like, and I like what I like!" There is fulfillment in the familiar, peace in the predictable, and contentment in what is comfortable. But we also know the cliché: familiarity breeds contempt.

This is a small part of why we underwent our summer worship experiment. Changing worship patterns allow us to experience God's presence in different ways, opening ourselves to something that just might spark faith! There's other reasons for the experiment too – like giving singers a break from leading every Sunday, and more time to practice for a better blended sound.

Nearing the end of our experiment, worship and music has asked for feedback so we can make decisions for the future of worship at Salem. But we are trying to make these decisions in a void – very few people (9) participated in giving feedback!

Here's what we heard:

- we need the notes to the unknown songs (a songbook/on the screen)
- "I was surprised that I liked it!" and "I was just going to skip, I'm glad I didn't"
- appreciated we didn't choose praise songs with repeating lines
- was hoping for more instruments to make the sound fuller (guitars, maybe drums)
- "I want other, younger, people to be welcome with music that speaks to them"
- a few didn't like the long time of singing before worship (both hymns and praise)
- stronger voices, sound is great, less bongos
- long time to stand during opening two songs
- what happened to sharing Christ's peace?

From that list, there are things we have already adapted. Some things are completely dependent on who offers their abilities (like a guitar player) or how we participate in songs we don't know.

About providing music notes - due to licensing restrictions, we cannot publish music notes. Salem would need to buy another license (\$200-250 per year), and we were not ready to invest this until we know the results of the experiment.

So – what are the results? We need to hear from you!! Do we go back to a blended style (hymns at the beginning, praise songs at the end)? Do we continue this alternating pattern for the rest of this year? How do you want to worship God together? Let us know by August 12 in writing or in conversation. (Question pages are on the usher stand – please sign your name so we can follow up!)

Thank you, Salem, for going along with something out of the ordinary this summer!

We joined Immanual Lutheran Church of Crosby again this year, as it was so successful last year. We had a volunteer staff of 37 Adults, about 14 teens and several 6th grade helpers. We are very thankful that our Memorial Committee voted to cover the \$15.00 registration fee, so that made VBS free to all children. This total of \$1,005.00 covers most of the cost of the program materials purchased from Group Publishing.

The big message we shared with the kids at VBS this year was that Jesus is a faithful friend we can always trust. JESUS IS OUR TRUE NORTH!

Church Council News

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Thank you to all of you who worked to make VBS a success and those of you who pack lunches for Lunch Bunch every Friday. Thank you to the Memorial Committee for providing the financial support for VBS.

We are now preparing for Deerwood Days. Please look at the sign-up sheets and see ways that you can be a part of this opportunity to reach out to our community and to raise money for our Outreach programs, our Church, and our Capital Appeal Campaign.

Our giving patterns have been down for the first part of the year. Our congregational meeting on July 27th was to inform you of the current situation and to look at priorities for the 2026 budgeting process. We want to hear from you. Call or talk to Council members if you did not attend the meeting.

On July 6, 2025, Chris Farrell had an article in the Minnesota Star Tribune titled: **Charitable giving rises, a sign of sound money management.** Total giving rose 3.3% after subtracting inflation." (Although the dollar amounts are smaller, studies suggest those with fewer resources give a greater proportion of their income than higher income peers.)" We have a very generous congregation, and we are optimistic that offerings and financial support will follow this trend. "Volunteering numbers also jumped: The Census Bureau and Americorps reported more than 28% of the population age 16 and older formally volunteered between September 2022 and September 2023. The number of volunteers is closing in on pre-pandemic levels." The percentage of Salem members who volunteer is much higher than this. The article concludes with: "Giving and volunteering also create a sense of meaning and fulfillment as individuals. This sense of purpose is why I believe giving should lie at the core of sound money management.

The questions we think about when giving and volunteering should influence other money choices, including what we spend our money on and how we save. Personal finance is about how to use our hard-earned money to support our values and goals through our giving, spending and saving habits."

In September, Outreach is looking at God's Work - Our Hands for ways to serve our community. Watch for more information.

We are looking for ways to replace Kathi and Sherri - our Kitchen Coordinators. Please share your ideas and consider ways to "fill their shoes."

Mustard Seed: Mustard Seed Sales for May 2025 were \$51,565.00.

Salem West Impact Report for the month of May: 31 referrals and 30 completed orders. A total of 67 individuals were helped. Total volunteer hours for May were 855.

There has been \$167,305 in goods delivered to the community YTD.

The In Kind impact is \$353,189.54 YTD.

Mustard Seed Report: Jake

Sales have been up for the summer which is good. Donations are coming in.

Furniture Barn is cleaned out. The plastic containers are all moved out so the barn is ready to go.

Jake will be going to Emily Days on July 19. He will have a booth set up to promote Salem Outreach/Mustard Seed and try to recruit new volunteers.

Survey was completed by volunteers. Wanted to make sure the volunteers were being heard and if there were any concerns that their voices were heard. The overall feedback from the survey was positive. Management was doing a great job.

New Business:

2026 Salem Outreach will be working with the Outreach Program in Brainerd Lakes to provide bags of food to the clients we serve at Salem West. These will be called Welcome Boxes. New referrals will receive freeze-dried bags of food with their order.

Bobcat Angle Broom – for ground cleanup and snow removal. We are looking to purchase this attachment for the skid loader. Cost is about \$2,650. This will help with the cleanup in the parking lot, behind the Mustard Seed back doors & snow removal.

Crib orders - Outreach purchased 20 cribs that have all been delivered to clients
