What communities are you part of? We've got parent groups and town events, neighborhoods and sports teams, Lions and Legion organizations (oh my!), and small groups of friends. It's easy to see how some of these communities are formed. We gather around common interests, shared experience, and similar concerns; humans gravitate toward like-minded people.

Some of these communities don't require much of us. Our neighborhood is one example – we are part of that community simply because our house is next to someone else's. Same with sports – we cheer together, we face defeat together, but when the game is over the community disbands. We can choose how involved we want to be: do you wave at neighbors or stop and talk? Do you high five the people in the bleachers or keep your attention on the court?

Being part of this faith community operates in much the same way. We are gathered by a common story in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and common trust that God is working to make all things new – including us! We gather each week to let that hope sink into our souls and then go back into the world God loves with that message for all of our communities.

It's also up to us how involved we want to be in this faith community. Some sign on for leadership, while others are ready to rest from their labors. But I'll tell you the same thing I tell new members in our orientation to the community: church is what you make it. If you want your faith community to be grounded in the Scriptures, you need to study your Bible. If you want your faith community to be welcoming, you need to greet people and get to know them (and do your best to remember their names). If you want your faith community to be prayer-ful, you need to be a person who devotes time to talking with God. If you want your faith community to matter outside these walls, you need to serve your neighbors with the same love Jesus showed (and tell these neighbors about the reason why you serve!)

This faith community is what you make it, dear siblings in Christ. As Romans 12 encourages us, "Let love be genuine; hate what is evil; hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal; be ardent in spirit; serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope; be patient in affliction; persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; pursue hospitality to strangers." (and more!)

Weather Cancelation Policy



Adopted by Council February 23, 2023

WEATHER CANCELATION POLICY For Salem Lutheran Church and Salem Outreach

- 1. First and foremost: If the weather is bad enough to question whether or not Worship is canceled, please err on the side of safety and stay at home.
- 2. The Pastor or Council President will determine church closures. The Director of Outreach or Council President will determine outreach closures.
- 3. In the case of inclement weather on a weekend, the decision about worship cancellation will be made by 7:00 a.m. Sunday morning.
- 4 The Pastor will make changes to the church phone message, website, and social media (Facebook and Instagram).
- 5. People in the congregation are encouraged to call the church for a voicemail message or check online church communications (listed in 3) for weather related announcements.
- 6. Each group (Quilters, Bible Study Group, Committee, etc) is responsible for informing the group of cancelations due to the weather.

MSC: Motion was made, seconded motion carried to start the meeting.

Opened with a prayer by Cathy Aykens

<u>Secretary's report</u> was emailed to board members. Changes to the secretary report; the date on the next board meeting is to state September 16th, 2025, not September 19th, 2025. Add Kay Bendorf to the meeting and not just Bendorf. Cathy Aykens approved the changes to the secretary's report. Kay Bendorf seconded the approval.

The financial report was approved. MSC. Motion of approval was made by Mark Boike and seconded by Cathy Aykens.

Mustard Seed: sales for August 2025 were \$61,795.00.

Salem West Impact Report for August: 52 referrals and 36 completed orders. A total of 75 individuals were helped. Total volunteer hours for August were 1,503.

There has been \$292,045 in goods delivered to the community YTD.

The in-kind impact is \$627,546.54 YTD.

Mustard Seed Report: Jake

Sales are up. Customer round up to the nearest dollar is up as well.

Jake reports the donations are still coming in, which is good for this time of year. We still need to recruit more volunteers. Many of our volunteers will be leaving for the winter. Karla and Brandy no longer work at the Mustard Seed. Looking to hire a cashier to replace Brandy's position.

Time to put out the Halloween décor, and then Thanksgiving stuff will be put out the following week. Facebook followers continue to grow. We are at 3,534 followers on Facebook and 571 Instagram followers.

New Business:

MN Teen Challenge – Oct 5th Outreach will host a pancake breakfast at Salem Lutheran Church. Volunteers are needed to help with the breakfast.

Electronic sign out in the front of the Mustard Seed/ Salem West store – Jason Kempthorne went over 3 proposals to replace the Mustard Seed / Salem West sign that is out in front of the store. A vote was taken, and the OGB decided to go with the RHL digital sign company out of St. Cloud. The cost of the digital sign is \$38,000. This will include the electrical hookup, the removal of the old sign and a 5-year warranty of the sign. A motion was made by Cathy Aykens and seconded by Nancy Tighe to use the money out of 1310-Social Ministry Savings to help pay for the sign. Social Ministry Savings 1310 currently has \$162,111.20 in this fund.

Yamaha Rhino Sale- Salem Outreach has a side-by-side that is no longer in use. The skidloader is taking care of all the needs. A motion was made by Cathy Aykens and seconded by Mark Boike to sell the Yamaha Rhino. The selling price for the Rhino is \$4,500.

Manage garbage bill- Jason Kempthorne went over the need for a garbage crusher/shredder. It is a machine that crushes and grinds up mattresses, furniture, and large plastic items. This grinder could help reduce the amount of garbage and dumpster space. We will look into fundraising or grant money to help fund this.

Worship opportunity: creating accessible worship for those with intellectual or developmental disabilities: Discussing the need with a group home. Slowly looking into this.

Outreach Report -Mark

2 staff left for other jobs. 1 no longer working there.

MN adult and teen challenge Oct. 5. Pancake Breakfast by Outreach

The Board approved the purchase of an electronic sign and overhead building sign.

West is selling the side by side.

Jason is looking at options to make garbage smaller.

Reviewed the budget.

Committee Reports:

<u>Capital Appeal</u> –October 19 is the 1-year anniversary of the campaign. Ice cream sundaes will be served. Looking at refinancing the mortgage which needs to be done in April 2026- Next meeting Jan. 13

<u>Faith Formation</u> –Met in Sept: worked on budget, confirmation, trunks and treats, and kids club. October 7 is the next meeting.

<u>Welcome-</u>Orientation classes Oct 12 and 19. Welcome new members on Oct. 26. There will be cake at coffee time.

<u>Compensation Work Group-</u> Had their final meeting and completed their work once the decision about the Praise Team singing 24 weeks instead of 52 weeks was made.

Unfinished Business:

HR Training- Training is out of our budget. Exec Committee decided that the employee policy manual will be reviewed at the first Exec Committee meeting each year. Pastor Amanda contacted Sourcewell for possible purchase of a one-time curriculum. Julie found two books on HR for churches but doesn't know if they are good. She will review.

Kitchen Coordinator position - Pastor Amanda and Julie Fritz contacted area churches to find out how they manage funerals and other meals. All have volunteers who serve meals, but the food is catered in from Super 1, or other caterers. For funerals, the funeral home orders for the family. The council agreed that Salem would work with the funeral home to order food for funerals. If Salem has a meal for other reasons, it will be catered. Care and Share will continue to provide volunteers when needed.

Nominating Committee- have started meetings and have brainstormed ideas. Calls are being made. Oct 2 is the next meeting.

New Business:

Thanksgiving offering/Worship plan- Worship will be at Salem at 6:30pm, Wednesday night. Will ask Cascade their ideas for worship plan. Will advertise that other churches can participate beyond Cascade and Salem.

Motion to give Thanksgiving Offering go to Lutheran World Relief- MSC. Will let other churches know.

Weather Cancellation Policy - Reviewed and will be published in October and November Connections. Will post on slides in church.

Fall Clean-up Day- Pastor Amanda will ask Facilities when they plan on a cleanup day. Pastor Housing Allowance:
