In southern England dating back to the 1700's, there was a strange ritual done on the last night of Christmas, January 5. Villagers would gather in the orchards amid the bare branches of their apple trees, and they would sing. As you can guess, there was some alcohol involved in the form of a wassail – a bowl of warmed ale with mead, cider, spices, and apples. (They had to stay warm somehow!) In the midst of the robust singing, blessings would be shouted at the trees and cider splashed on the roots, all for the sake of next year's harvest.

The practice spread to include home blessings as well, with carolers traveling within the village, stopping at their neighbor's homes, and singing their blessings. We have two carols from this practice:

Here we come a-wassailing among the leaves so green, here we come a-wand'ring so fair to be seen. Love and joy come to you, and to you your wassail too; and God bless you and send you a happy New Year, and God send you a happy New Year.

We wish you a merry Christmas, we wish you a merry Christmas, we wish you a merry Christmas, and a happy New Year! Good tidings we bring to you and your kin, good tidings of a Christmas and a happy New Year!

The hope of Advent feels very much like this practice. Today, we tromp around in a world that looks very dead: the trees and bushes are all bare, save a few defiant oak leaves. We tiptoe around conversations with family and friends knowing that every topic can be dangerously polarizing, so we silence parts of ourselves. Yet in the face of what may suck the life out of us, we dare stand and say, "We believe you've got life in you yet."

Advent looks at the world the way it is and blesses it. We shout life in what looks dead and gone. Rather than a decoration, we make a declaration. We shout hope into the void. We sing songs of peace in the face of the fighting. We exult in joy over the blessings we look for and name. We dare to love in self-giving ways. We show up in hope – not because everything is fine, but because God is not finished yet.

Whatever is ahead of you – this month, this holiday, this coming year – may you continue in the work of Advent and wassail all of it. Keep blessing what is bare, empty, and unfruitful. And may your love, your prayers, and your shaky songs be trust that God is still on the way.

## Weather Cancellation Policy



### WEATHER CANCELLATION POLICY For Salem Lutheran Church and Salem Outreach

Adopted by Council February 23, 2023

1. First and foremost: If the weather is bad enough to question whether or not Worship is canceled, please err on the side of safety and stay at home.
2. The Pastor or Council President will determine church closures. The Director of Outreach or Council President will determine outreach closures.
3. In the case of inclement weather on a weekend, the decision about worship cancellation will be made by 7:00 a.m. Sunday morning.
4. The Pastor will make changes to the church phone message, website, and social media (Facebook and Instagram).
5. People in the congregation are encouraged to call the church for a voicemail message or check online church communications (listed in 3) for weather related announcements.
6. Each group (Quilters, Bible Study Group, Committee, etc) is responsible for informing the group of cancellations due to the weather.

## Honduras Mission Clarification

*Here I Am, Lord*

*Refrain*

Here I am, Lord. Is it I, Lord? I have heard you calling in the night.  
I will go, Lord, if you lead me. I will hold your people in my heart.

A group of volunteers from Salem, our local community, the Bay Lake Fellowship, and North Star Methodist in Alaska want to respond as the refrain from the hymn, **I, the Lord of Sea and Sky**. We have seen people living in a home consisting of a PCV pipe frame with quilts for the sidewalls and a plastic tarp roof and a dirt floor. The homes that we constructed on the last trip had cement floors, painted wood walls, corrugated tin roof, and a door that has a padlock. We have watched children run with joy to playground equipment, jump into the creek to cool off in the water, seen their intense eyes as they experience Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross, and their curiosity as they sit in the tomb and see the stone rolled away.

This fall the Church Council and Outreach Governing Board voted not to support a mission trip in 2026. There are people who feel that mission support takes away financial support for the church. Our Mission Statement says: We exist to **Welcome** people to Jesus Christ, **Equip** them with a faith that works in their lives, and to **Send** them into the world in Jesus' name. A group of people intend to continue the longtime practice of serving those in need and are planning a trip to Honduras in 2026.

The volunteers on the Honduras Mission Team pay for their own airfare, lodging, and food so our church is not paying for those expenses. The Honduras Team holds two fundraisers allowed in the Salem Fundraising Policy. Attending the fundraisers is optional. The money raised goes to bring children to Bible Camp at Kids Ark, provide food for children at feeding stations, and to buy materials to construct homes. Many members of our congregation have been part of previous Mission Teams and continue to support this work even if they are not able to go. We appreciate being a part of such a generous community of caring people so that we are able to be Jesus' hands and feet in Honduras.

We are thankful for your continued prayer support. If you are able to support this mission without reducing your support of the church and the capital appeal, we appreciate your help. We always welcome new members to our team if you are feeling the Lord's calling.

The in-kind impact is \$712,624 YTD.

Mustard Seed Report: Jake

Taste of Christmas planning is well underway; we are looking for additional volunteers to pull off the annual event. Setup is November 17-18, and the store is open Nov 19 – 29. Radio and print advertising is already in the works

The new LED sign is installed and looks good. Jake and Jason are trained to update the information.

We have new hires. A cashier and a driver. Still looking for a delivery helper to catch up on the workload.

Facebook followers continue to grow. We are at 3575 followers on Facebook and 571 Instagram followers.

Customer round-up of sales is up 145% over last year, and average ticket sales are \$17.40. Our price per piece remains similar to last year. Men's clothing sales have also increased over the last year due to better merchandising.

2026 Budget was discussed. Since lack of quorum at the end of the meeting the changes were made and emailed to the board. Motion to approve the budget by Cathy Aykens second by Mark Boike. Voting will take place by email.

Holiday store closure was discussed. Motion was made to close Dec 22 – Jan 4. Motion made by Cathy Aykens and seconded by Mark Boike. MSC.
