I've noticed that whatever sermon I'm writing tends to influence these "from the Pastor" notes. Having just returned from vacation, I'm working to address all the concerns that came up while I was away, preparing for the council goal-setting mid-January, and I have yet to put any creative thought into how Salem can honor the season of Lent that begins mid-February.

It's also the start of a new year with what the culture promises if we work hard enough, we can also be "a new me." I have high expectations of myself, urgent changes to better care for my body and soul, character flaws that I have left unchecked for too long.

I wonder if you might face the same pressure. Some of our octo-and nona-genarians have honestly confessed they still struggle with the same things, wondering if they will ever be free from their own flaws, wondering if sin will ever loosen its hold. We feel behind like we're failing to grow or mature, feel like we're missing something essential to being human, feel like changing ourselves and our ways is impossible. "New year, new me" is an awfully empty aim.

So faith feeds us something different. Early every January we hear "new year, new name." The Baptism of Jesus is read every year where Jesus comes out of the water and before he has done anything, he hears the voice of the Father: "You are my beloved Son, in you I am well pleased."

We are baptized with the same words, the same promise, the same Fatherly love. In the face of our flaws and failures, the face of our mounting to-do lists, the expectations for all things to be "new" and different and our willpower to finally prevail, we hear that we are loved – just as we are. Before you check a box, before you achieve some kind of zen, before your ducks are all quacking in a row, you are loved.

Maybe if we take the pressure off, we can be free to see the many things we get right. We can see ourselves the way God sees us. We can rest in the fact that we're forgiven, and then allow that love to change us. We can allow God's Spirit to make us new, into the image of the Son instead of some better version of ourselves. Just as you are, right now, you are loved by God.

I will not apologize if you hear this same message from me on Sunday – it bears repeating. And if you have one goal this year, let it be that you rest in the love your heavenly Father has for you.

The in kind impact is \$796,427.34 YTD.

- Annual Meeting Review- It was deer opening. Need to move so it doesn't conflict- Next year will be November 1 and it won't conflict with deer hunting. We present the budget for 2 weeks before the annual meeting, but everyone goes to first week and not the second.

For this year, there are 8 people confirmed that are going to Honduras. Don would like the council to reverse their previous decision to skip a year and not have a Honduras or local mission trip because of the finances of the church. There was no motion made. The Honduras group will be going on their own.
